Mr. Smith's letter follows: "To the readers of the Carson Press: "I beg space in your valuable paper to inform the public that I have severed my connection with the Grant County Leader as editor (?) thereof."

Adjou, Canned Editorials. "During the short time I have been a resident of Carson, I have enjoyed associations with some very good American citizens, but none of those has in any manner been connected with the 'Leader' nor with the Nonpartisan league. ### RETAIL MERCHANTS OF 'FRISCO COMBINE TO REDUCE PRICE

San Francisco, Feb. 6.—Three organizations of San Francisco retail merchants including the big dealers in clothing, drygoods and shoes have combined in a campaign to reduce living costs. John H. Atwood, special assistant to the United States attorney general, announced here today. In large newspaper advertisements the organizations will advise consumers here to buy only essentials. Atwood said. Several large stores have agreed to hold up contemplated improvements, aggregating in one case \$1,000,000, so that selling costs may be kept down, according to the assistant attorney general, who has been investigating the cost of living in the west.

The merchants, he said, have agreed not to mark up prices on goods on hand when an advance in price in the commodity is announced. Atwood, who planned to go to Tacoma, Wash., announced today he had been recalled to Washington for a conference with Attorney General Palmer and believed that he would not return to the Pacific coast.

### Bernstorff Surprised At Allies' Demand For Trial

Berlin, Feb. 6.—One of the most surprised men in Berlin was Count Von Bernstorff, former ambassador to

the United States who, it is said, is dejected by the allies for his alleged connections with Holo Pasha. The count, despite his surprise, seemed to be mildly amused. He declared that he was not afraid to face trial. He added that he was ready to go if wanted and that he might even go to the allies in a quinary if they attempted to prosecute him.
