

REGINA BASEBALL ARTISTO MAY TRAIN IN SALEM THIS YEAR

The news that Salem is at last on the road to the possession and maintenance of a first class baseball park has traveled afar. Biddle Bishop, promoter of the enterprise and manager of the Salem Spens, has received a tentative letter from Billie Spens, manager of the well known Regina club.

Spens is in search of better training grounds for his crew and if the park at Twelfth and Oxford streets can be put into immediate condition, Biddle is sure that the popular Canadian club will come to Salem and invest their training time and money here.

In the possibility of the Regina's coming here, Biddle sees an opportunity for sterling practice for the Senators and that is what the local boys are all looking for.

While ready response has been shown by all who have heard of the Senators need for a generous series of subscriptions financial aid, Manager Bishop has announced that plans for a thorough campaign are being formulated. He emphasizes that the quest for funds will not be so thoroughly a personal canvass.

Bishop's big idea is that the major portion of the necessary funds should come voluntarily from Salem citizens who believe in the clean sport and the great American game—baseball.

KING ALFONSO MAY ENTER BIG OLYMPIC GAMES

San Sebastian, Spain, Thursday, Feb. 19.—In connection with the arrival here of Spanish Villamor, president of the Spanish Olympic games committee, it is reported King Alfonso may consent to participate in the Olympic games at Antwerp next summer as a rifleman and polo player. Preparations are being made for the training of a Spanish athletic team which will participate in the Olympic games for the first time on invitation of King Albert of Belgium.

AMERICA'S PART IN FEEDING ALLIES SHOWN

Washington, Feb. 19.—America's part in feeding the war stricken nations of Europe is shown in the reports of the department of commerce today, which put the total wheat exports from the United States in 1919 at over 35,000,000 bushels more than the 1918 shipments.

During the past year the United States exported 145,956,470 bushels of wheat, representing an increase in value of over \$96,000,000. Wheat flour, however, advanced only by approximately 4,500,000 barrels over the 1918 export total.

England led as a market for American wheat in 1919, taking 44,513,552 bushels valued at \$107,503,619 with Italy importing 38,264,883 bushels worth \$91,024,925. Standing third France took 27,599,718 bushels valued at \$66,552,535, Belgium, with a total of 24,476,439 bushels, valued at \$59,991,083 was fourth.

Prince to Sail on Long Trip to Antipodes March 5

London, Feb. 20.—The Prince of Wales will leave on his trip to the Antipodes on March 5, on which date his ship, the dreadnaught Renown will depart from Portsmouth, according to the official itinerary given out today. He will arrive at Colon March 21. The next day will be occupied in the progress through the Panama canal and then the Renown will turn northward, touching San Diego, Cal., March 31.

From this port the trip across the Pacific will be begun and the schedule provides for reaching Honolulu April 6, the Fiji Island April 12 and Auckland April 17.

GIANT EELS

It is said there are eels no one can land. Some years ago a giant conger was caught in shallow water off the shores of England. It measured 8 feet 8 inches in length, and weighed 148 pounds. Congers half that size have been known to bite a man's hand in two and to have driven their teeth through the blade of an axe.

In 1913 Kakamaku, the champion swimmer of Honolulu, was attacked by a giant eel which dragged him under water and held him there for nearly two minutes. He escaped at last, but at the cost of a finger from his right hand.

Eels attain an immense size in the rivers of New Zealand and have been known to attack bathers. In fact, many cases of drowning have been proven to be where eels have dragged the bathers beneath the surface of the water.

ARCHANGEL TAKEN BY REDS, IS REPORT

London, Feb. 20.—Bolshevik forces have captured Archangel, on the White sea, according to a wireless dispatch from Moscow today. The "whites" abandoned the town and the troops joined the bolsheviks, the message declares.

The last advices to the British war office on the north Russian situation were that on February 18 the red forces were seventy miles south of Archangel.

Bolshevik possession of the city would mean a material weakening of the Divina line.

Archangel for a long period during the war was the main port of entry for war supplies from the allies to the armies of the old regime of Russia and after the revolution to the forces of the Koresnsky government.

With the advent of the bolshevik rule in Russia Archangel was maintained by the allies as a base for contact with interior Russia and later as the supply depot for the forces of the north Russian government established in opposition to the bolshevik and for the allied troops, including a considerable number of Americans, sent in to help protect the North Russia area from bolshevik incursion.

Abandonment of the Archangel expedition by the allied and associated powers was determined upon last year and the British, American and other allied forces there were withdrawn during the summer and fall.

London advices bearing Thursday's date reported the beginning of an offensive by bolshevik forces on the front south of Archangel.

ROSEBURG MILL AND TIMBER TRACT SOLD TO EASTERNERS

Roseburg, Or., Feb. 20.—A large timber deal was closed here Thursday when the sawmill property and 10,000,000 feet of Douglas fir located at Cleveland and owned by W. R. Vinson was sold to J. W. and M. G. Smith, experienced mill men from Kentucky and Texas.

The Smiths will make extensive improvements at once, add new machinery, build tramways, obtain trucks and market the lumber in Sutherland and Roseburg.

AID TO CENSUS ASKED

Washington, Feb. 20.—An appeal to the farmers for fuller co-operation with the census bureau was issued today by Secretary of Agriculture Meredith. The delay and difficulty in taking the census of the farms, the secretary said, has become a matter of serious concern. Part of the delay was ascribed to adverse weather conditions. Farmers were asked by Mr. Meredith to assist the work by notifying the department of any farms which have been overlooked by enumerators.

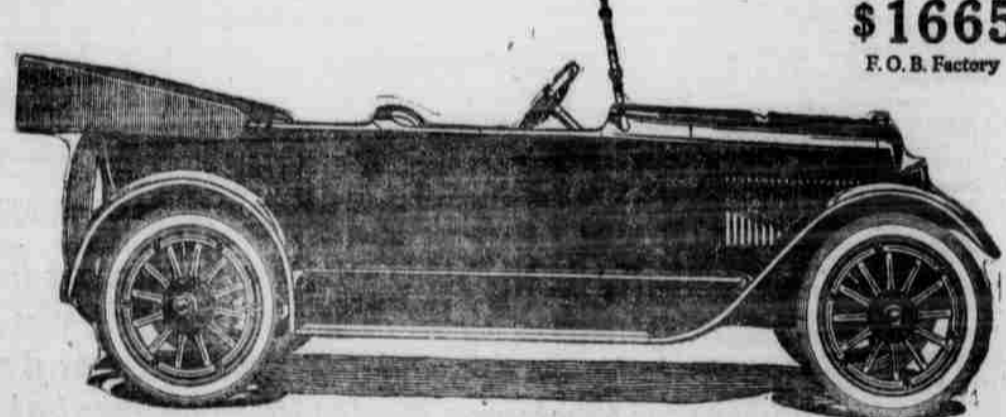
