### HEAD OF PORTLAND BLIND SCHOOL ASKS VOTES FOR MEASURE

"I owe my independence to the fact that through the generosity of another state I received training in piano tuning, chair caning, basketry and broom making. Thus I have been able to support myself and family. Otherwise I would probably have been dependent upon charity. I might today be setting pencils or shoestrings on a corner."

Thus does J. F. Myers, principal of Portland's school for the sightless, plead for the support of the bill providing for the erection of a state employment institution for the blind to be located in Portland. In an argument in behalf of the measure filed with the secretary of state's office this morning for publication in the official voters pamphlet.

"For the sake of the 500 adult blind in Oregon who can be helped to become self supporting I ask voters for the bill proposing a small tax for an Oregon employment institution for the blind, to be located in Portland. Such an institution will be like a ray of light in the darkness to the sightless of this state."

"Lines of employment for sightless persons are well defined and limited. The prime object of this institution is to instruct the sightless along all practical lines in which they may become self supporting and provide a means for their permanent employment after they have become proficient in their various trades."

"For nearly six years I have been principal and instructor in the Portland school for the adult blind. This institution is supported by the board of education which is obviously the duty of the state rather than the work of the city school board."

"Should this institution be established the taxpayers will be rewarded well because it will be of great economic value to the state."

"In the name of the sightless of Oregon of which I am one I solicit your support at the polls and ask that you help to make possible this institution for the aid of the blind."

### FIGHT FOR CANINES ROUSES INTEREST; RESPONSE IS GOOD

"That the dogs of Salem and vicinity have some very real and sincere friends is being proven in the affluence of the general public in regard to the petitions being circulated in Salem at this time."

The committee in charge of petition circulation has received nearly fifty applications from voluntary petition circulators. T. G. Bligh and others members of this committee report that there are 20 petitions out at the present time and that 17 of these are in the hands of voluntary circulators.

According to the first survey of these uncompleted petitions, over 500 signatures have been affixed as being in favor of the repeal of the stringent city laws now in force against canines. Those in charge of the petition work state that there is a general attitude of friendliness exhibited by those who express a determination to bring about conditions "at least as tolerable" for these dumb animals as those liberties enjoyed by the person who made these cruel laws "as one woman expressed it. Col. E. K. Hofer, who has made an active fight in favor of better and more definite regulations concerning canines has expressed himself as opposed to the manner of anonymous campaign against dogs as conducted by an unknown person in the pages of a morning paper published here."

### LEADER OF MEXICAN REBELS CAPTURED BY SECRET POLICE

Mexico City, Mar. 1.—Cirilo Arenas, a rebel leader, has been captured by secret military police at Puebla, according to an official telegram. Arenas was taken into custody when he attempted to enter the city of Puebla after leaving the Gulf coast region. About a year ago a brigade of soldiers under command of Arenas and protecting the Inter-Oceanic railroad revolted after Arenas received a large sum for the payment of the troops.

Semi-official reports announce the capture of Marcelo Carazo, in the state of Tamaulipas.

Newspapers here in commenting upon the capture of Arenas and Carazo point out the progress made by the present administration toward "complete pacification of the country" before the July elections.

Among outlaws who have been put to death or slain in battle during the past year were Felipe Angeles, Aureliano Blasquez, Francisco Alvarez, Jose Ines Chavez Garcia and Emiliano Zapata. Among those captured were Gaudencio De La Llave and Meixueiro is said to be negotiating with federal officials preparatory to surrendering.

The capture or surrender of more than a score of outlaws throughout the country also occurred during the year. This leaves only Francisco Villa, who is operating with a small force in a circumference district in the north, and Manuel Pelaez and Felix Diaz, who are virtually powerless in the Gulf coast region.
