

JURYMAN IN BISBEE DEPORTATION CASE SUICIDE BY SHOOTING

Tombstone, Ariz., Mar. 4.—C. F. Burnett, a juror in the trial of Harry E. Wootton, charged with kidnapping in connection with the Bisbee deportations, shot and killed himself at his ranch nine miles northeast of Courtland last night, according to information reaching the county attorney's office today.

Burnett was a juror until Tuesday, when he appeared before Judge Samuel L. Pattee and attorneys for both sides and said he had a "confession" to make. He said he had expressed opinions to his brother concerning the right or wrong of the deportation striking copper miners and their sympathizers from Bisbee, but that when he was examined and passed as a juror these conversations were forgotten. Burnett left Tombstone last night

for his ranch. It was reported that almost immediately after his arrival home Burnett took out a pistol and shot himself in the head.

At the county attorney's office here it was believed Burnett was temporarily insane.

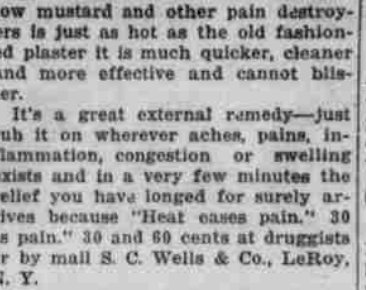
