The president is led to speak with less reserve on account of the frank observations of the French and British prime ministers. He is unable to find in the exigencies of military strategy sufficient warrant for exercising secrecy with a government which was intimately associated with the signatories of the treaty of London in the gigantic task of defending human freedom and limited assistance and for untold treasure.

The absence of an American representative with plenary power is to be regretted and may have been a source of inconvenience but the president can recall several instances where decisions in the supreme council were delayed while the British and French representatives sought the view of their governments and he is convinced that time would have been saved and many misunderstandings avoided if before such decisions had been reached and communicated to the Italian and Jugoslav delegations this government had been given sufficient indication of the intentions of the British and French governments intended radically to depart from the memorandum of December 9.

In conclusion, the president desires to express his concurrence in the view of the British and French ministers that a speedy settlement of the Adriatic question is of urgent importance. But he cannot accept as just the implied suggestion of his responsibility for the failure to reach a solution. He has merely adhered to the provisions of a settlement which the French and British governments recognized as equitable in the joint memorandum of December 9 and has declined to approve a new settlement negotiated without the knowledge or approval of the American government, which was unacceptable to one of the interested governments and which, in his opinion, was in direct contradiction of the principle for the defense of which America entered the war.

British Plan To reap When 'Yank' Travelers Come

London, Mar. 8. — Americans who contemplate coming to England this spring or summer, and Londoners expect there will be thousands of them, should be definitely assured before leaving that hotel accommodations have been arranged. Otherwise it is probable they may be unable to find a place to stay, particularly in London.

It will be difficult for London to handle a great influx of people this summer, say the managers, and they expect many disappointments among Americans who even attempt to arrange accommodations some time ahead of arrival. The better hotels of the city cannot find rooms for more than 4000 at one time, they are full now and many people have engaged rooms months ahead.

Public Officials Entitled To Funds For Duty Expense

Public officials cannot travel at public expense merely because they are public officials, but such officials, while engaged in the performance of public business that is germane to their official duties, have a right to travel at public expense. In the opinion of Attorney General Brown, the attorney general's opinion was prepared in reply to a query from Walter H. Evans, district attorney for Multnomah county, as to whether or not the board of county commissioners of Multnomah county has the right to expend county money in defraying the necessary traveling expenses of one of its members upon a trip east in company with an architect for the purpose of inspecting a number of hospitals in order to decide more intelligently upon the plans for a new hospital to be built in Multnomah county.

Currency Lack Is Shown By Flights

Sydney, Australia, Mar. 8. — One of the aviation difficulties revealed by the flight of Captain Ross Smith from England to Australia was that of obtaining money to pay bills in the currency of the country in which they happened to alight. Said one of the party: "We would fly 500 or 600 miles and late in the day would arrive in a country with a new currency, and could not pay for our things."

Warsaw, Mar. 8. — The American and French systems of government are being studied by members of the constitutional commission engaged in framing the constitution of the new Polish state.

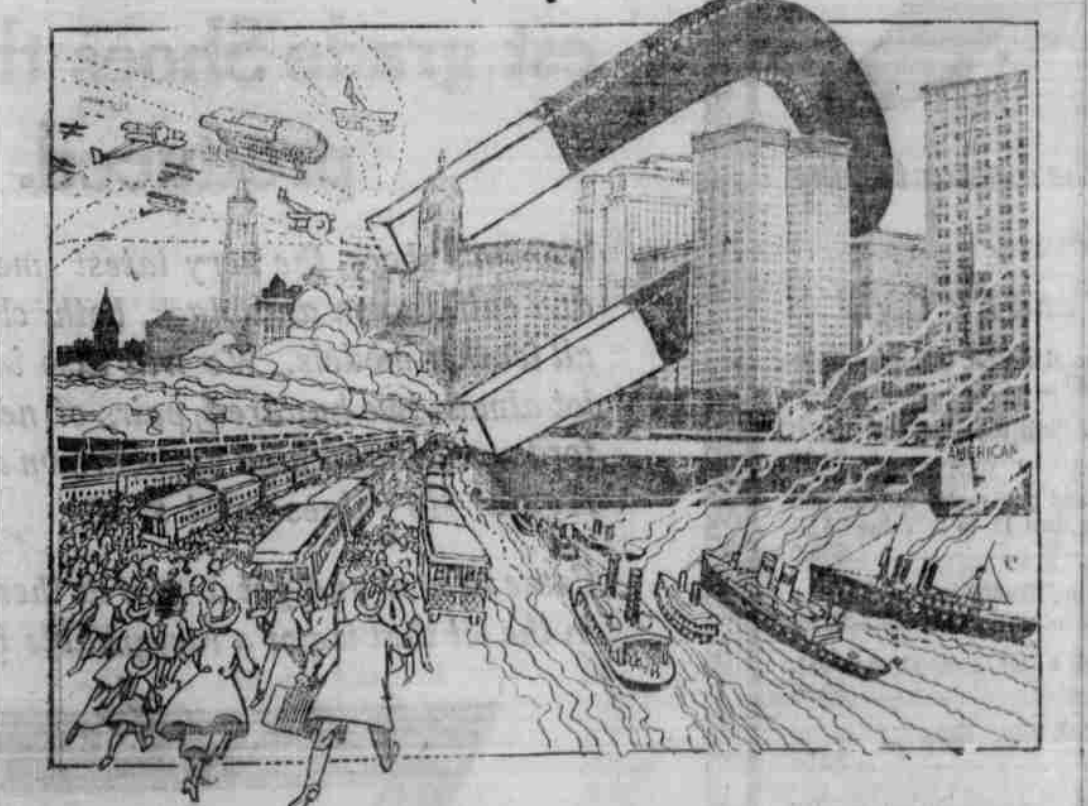
Persia's Case Is Up To Supreme Council
