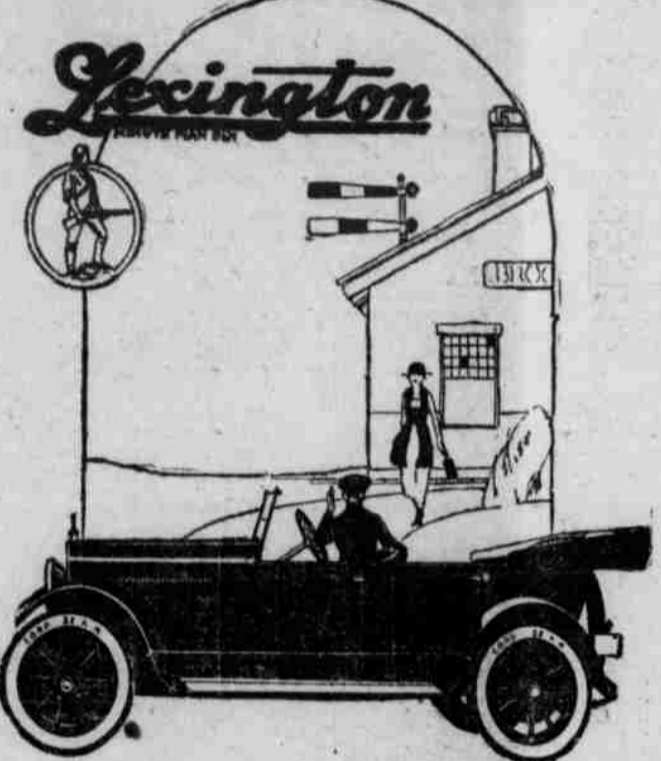
### Sugar Prices In Portland Soar
