

Salem Citizens Aid University In State Survey

Several prominent citizens of Salem who are known to be in touch with local civic needs have received letters this week asking them to represent the University of Oregon in their locality. They will secure data for the records of the state wide survey as to mental defect, delinquency, and dependency which the legislature requested at its last session when it passed a concurrent resolution asking for this information so as to be able to have accurate figures on the subject as a basis for intelligent legislation in the future. At the request of the extension division of the university, the U. S. public health service is cooperating with the state and has sent Dr. Chester L. Carlisle from Washington, D. C. to Oregon to take charge of the work as director. The headquarters of the survey is the office of the extension division of the University of Oregon at Eugene, to which all correspondence should be addressed.

Entente Forced Iron Brigade On Germany, Claim

Berlin, Mar. 24.—Discussing the political situation growing out of the revolt led by Dr. Wolfgang Kapp, Eduard David, minister without portfolio in the Ebert cabinet, told the Associated Press, today, the "Baltic troops were a gift to us by the entente."

He charged the allies had compelled Germany not only to recognize the refractory Iron brigade, but had ordered it returned to Germany after the troops were virtually under Russian colors.

"We disown them," Here David declared. "We branded them, as deserters and adventurers and were glad to get rid of them and then the entente forced us to withdraw them behind the German frontier against our wishes and better judgment."

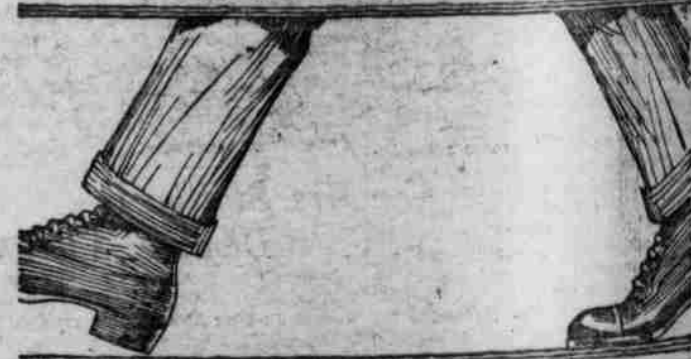
