

Accident Fund Shows Surplus of Near Million

A gain of \$175,498.48 in the unassigned surplus of the industrial accident fund in the eight month period ending March 1, 1920, is shown in a financial statement just filed with Governor Olcott by the state industrial accident commission.

The statement shows a total surplus of \$1,111,311.16 on March 1, last, as against a surplus of \$641,812.68 on June 30, 1919, this figure including the \$400,000 transferred from the general accident fund to construct and equip an industrial reconstruction hospital, by act of the 1919 legislature and returned to the fund by act of the special session.

Assets and liabilities of the fund totaling \$4,008,410.07 are shown as follows:

Assets: On deposit with state treasurer invested in bonds \$3,610,638.89; cash \$122,245.07; total deposited with state treasurer \$3,742,883.96; cash in bank \$139,932.57; total cash assets \$3,882,816.53; premiums in course of collection \$65,479.52; accrued interest, estimated, \$60,113.72; total all assets \$4,008,410.07.

Liabilities: Claim reserves segregated fund, \$2,244,536.92; accrued interest segregated fund, estimated, \$40,000.00; reserve catastrophe fund \$68,072.76; reserve rehabilitation fund \$108,296.86; reserve necessary to meet claim payments covered by outstanding final settlement vouchers \$2500; reserve permanent partial disability not over twenty four months \$71,327.11; reserve, estimated, based on accident experience to take care of pending claims \$611,323.25; unearned premiums \$15,888.86; unclaimed claim warrants \$2183.71; unpaid

Wood Assured Of South Dakota On Face Of Returns

SIOUX FALLS, S. D., Mar. 25.—Primary election returns from remote and isolated districts of South Dakota are expected to arrive by mail today and provide practically a complete state vote. Returns compiled late last night for republican presidential endorsement from 1185 of 1740 state precincts included but a dozen large voting places in the state and gave: Wood, 27,666; Lowden, 23,385; Johnson, 21,735.

Six counties which have not reported will add a small vote to the total. State records show that these counties cast a total vote of less than 2000 for the republican candidates for governor in 1916.

Efforts to obtain figures on the contest for democratic endorsement for president between James W. Gerard, New York, and James O. Monroe of Maywood, Ill., have not been successful.
