

### Game With Fast Club Is Placed For April 11th

As for Nick Williams, manager of the Moosejaw club, no boasts of what his team will do to the Salem club emanate from his office. The Canadian manager made this date with Eddie, because he states that he feels sure that the Salem manager has a good team here. After the Sunday game, the Moosejaw team plays a four day series with the University of Oregon and other teams at Eugene.

April 17, the team returns to Salem and plays a series of six games, April 17-22 inclusive. These games will complete the pre-season schedule of the southern nine and on April 22 they leave Portland for Canada, where they expect to clean up records in the All-Canadian series.

For the opening game, Bishop has secured the services of Governor O'Connell, Mayor Otto Wilson and Thomas R. Kay, who will give an "exhibition" game, the "lineup" being announced later.

### Willamette Wins From Mc Minnville And Pacific Teams

Willamette university won from McMinnville college and Pacific university in the triangular debate held Saturday night on the Mexican question, getting four votes to three for Pacific and two for McMinnville. Each negative team won, but Willamette won unanimously and the affirmative team which debated here received one vote, giving the Methodists the victory in the final score.

The debate here with Pacific was one of the best heard in Salem this year. The local affirmative team had improved greatly over their former showing against C. P. K. and were almost perfect in delivery, but the logic of the question kept them from winning. One of Pacific's speakers was a real fire eating orator, but the other might as well have passed out printed circulars as far as delivery is concerned. This was the final men's debate, but three women's contests will be staged here.

### Bandit And Police Officer Killed In Robbery At Seattle

Seattle, Wash., Apr. 5.—One Seattle officer, Deputy Sheriff Robert C. Scott and one alleged automobile bandit, Elmer Cady, were dead here today as the result of shooting early yesterday. A "third bandit, known only as "Blackie" was a fugitive, wanted on a charge of killing his brother robber.

Scott was killed by the holdup men when he and other officers attempted to halt a hold-up in the Rainier valley residence section of the city. After killing Scott, the robbers commandeered an automobile and made its owner, Earl M. Eba, drive at a 50-mile clip toward the heart of the city. On the way, Eba reported, "Blackie" killed Cady and robbed him of his loot.

"Blackie" left the car at a downtown corner after ordering Eba to drive Cady to a hospital.

### Coroner To Probe Death Of Youth

Portland, Or., Apr. 5.—A coroner's inquest was held tonight over the body of Wayne Cason, son of a Portland attorney, killed last night during a struggle with members of the local police force. Cason, according to the police, was arrested for drunkenness and resisted arrest. Three policemen were required to take him to the police station, where the police say, he again showed resistance. During the struggle, the police say, a revolver fell from the pocket of one of the officers, accidentally discharging, the bullet penetrating Cason's lung, entering the body under the arm.

### Baker Man Seeks Sinnott's Place In Lower House

James Harvey Graham of Baker, democrat, seeks to don the congressional toga now worn by Congressman N. J. Sinnott, Graham's petition for the democratic nomination was filed with the secretary of state's office here Saturday, places him on record for the following planks:

"A pure fabric law; liberal appropriation for irrigation projects; increase in income tax exemption to \$1,000 for single persons, \$1000 for married persons, our war debts should be largely paid by the idle rich, swollen fortunes and profiteers; support of the eighteenth amendment; opposed to light wines and beers; farmers should become citizens or suffer deportation; profiteers should be curbed and punished; appropriation for disabled soldiers and sailors, farm loans; protectorate of Christian powers over Jerusalem; law prohibiting price fixing; government ownership of trunk line railroads; immediate ratification of the peace treaty with covenant of nations."

Miss Celia L. Gavin of The Dalles filed as a candidate for presidential elector on the democratic ticket. Miss Gavin is at present city attorney of The Dalles.

### New York Harbor Closed To Export Trade By Strike

New York, Apr. 5.—Traffic in New York harbor was still curtailed today by the strike of harbor employes but the ferry lines, except those of the Erie and West Shore railroads were operating on virtually normal schedules.

Railroad officials claimed that all danger of interruption of the food and coal supply had been averted.

Union officials asserted that the harbor would be tied up before nightfall, claiming that a misunderstanding in orders yesterday had prevented all the workers from joining the strike.

### Governor Invites Prince Of Wales To Visit Oregon

Governor Olcott today extended a formal invitation to the prince of Wales to visit Oregon on his tour of the Pacific coast states. In his letter which is addressed to the prince at San Diego, Cal., where his ship is expected to touch in a few days, Governor Olcott calls attention to the fact that during the war the second battalion of the 162d United States infantry, an Oregon regiment was stationed in England for a considerable length of time.
