

Dr. Oftedal Did Not Leave Unpaid Bills, Nor Skip

Monitor, Or., May 5.—After a careful investigation of matters pertaining to an article which appeared in The Capital Journal under date of April 13, in which it was stated that Dr. Oftedal had abandoned his store in Monitor and left for parts unknown without giving notice to his creditors, it is learned that the reporter had been misinformed. Dr. Oftedal, it seems, assigned his stock of goods to an adjustment company in Portland, and creditors were given 60 cents on a dollar. Mr. Gillis, having been one of the latter, took over the stock of goods which were located in his building. Dr. Oftedal did go to eastern Oregon on business, but his family remained in Monitor, and he had no intention of leaving permanently, or of trying to evade payment of bills. This correction is made freely and gladly in justice to the doctor in question and to The Capital Journal, whose aim is to be truthful in all statements.

City Zoned To Aid Removal Of Refuse

Preparatory to aiding in the "clean-up week" which begins in the eve of May 10, the municipal street department has zoned the city and will haul off rubbish, and refuse in the most systematic way. That the work of removing the waste may be expedited Street Commissioner Low asked today that citizens place the waste in receptacles at the west end of all alleys running east and west, and at the north end of all alleys running north and south. As teams will not make more than one trip to each alley days have been designated when the rubbish should be on hand to be removed. On Monday, May 10, all rubbish collected in that district south of Mill street will be

removed. Tuesday it will be removed in that district between Mill and Union streets, covering the business district. Wednesday teams will operate north of Union street. The city limits are the east and west boundaries of all zones.
