Member Argentina Seeks To Allay Fear Of Monroe Doctrine

Buenos Aires.—Martin Travieso, member of the Porto Rican senate and who has temporarily served as governor of that island, has been making a tour of South America and endeavoring to allay suspicions of Latin-Americans concerning the Monroe Doctrine.

Senator Travieso appealed to Americans in South America, in an address before the American Club here, to use their best efforts to prove to citizens of the Monroe Doctrine was not the expression of an imperialistic policy on the part of the United States.

Mr. Travieso said that the conduct of the United States toward Cuba and Porto Rico were examples that could be cited to show that the United States had no imperialistic aims.

Speaking as a Latin American, he declared that it was very important to allay the unfounded suspicion that of many Latin-Americans that the motives of the United States in maintaining the Monroe Doctrine were not to protect Latin-American countries from European interference, but rather to obtain political control of them which would be to the benefit of the United States commercially.

"Perhaps in the future," he said, "the United States may constitute us into a sovereign people, but that is a problem which will have to be resolved by future generations. We enjoy today all the rights and liberties of the freest people of the world and we have no reason for complaint or protest in our present situation."
