

Monmouth Votes 1000 In Bonds For Gymnasium

May 14.—School directors of the town of Monmouth have voted to issue \$10,000 in bonds for the erection of a new gymnasium. The vote was taken at a special meeting held at the town hall last night. The proposition was to issue \$10,000 in bonds at a rate of 5% to be repaid over a period of 20 years. The bonds are to be used for the purchase of a lot on which to erect a gymnasium of approximately 10,000 square feet. The school directors also voted to issue \$5,000 in bonds for the purchase of a lot for a new school building. The total amount of bonds to be issued is \$15,000.

New Officers Are Elected At Meet Of Fruit Packers

An entire new slate of officers was elected for the ensuing year at the annual meeting of the Northwest Fruit Packers' association, held at the Hotel Marion Wednesday afternoon. The directors and stockholders of the Northwest Fruit Packers' association, important business matters, the nature of which was not made public, occupied the attention of the packers during much of the session. The following men were named directors: C. L. Dick, of Manon-Erhmann company; A. C. Peterson, California; Packers' association; W. F. Drager, Drager Fruit company; J. O. Holt, Eugene Fruit Growers' association; and W. W. Silver, Dundee Fruit Growers & Packers. W. F. Drager was elected president to succeed W. G. Allen whose term expired; A. C. Peterson was named to succeed J. O. Holt, vice-president, and C. L. Dick succeeded Robert C. Paulus as secretary.

Owners Refuse To Reinstiate Butte "Job Strikers"

Butte, Mont., May 13.—Following the action taken by Metal Mine Workers Industrial Union number 800 I. W. W., Butte branch, last night in declaring its strike at the mines off a number of men made application this morning for employment as miners. To last night's resolution was attached a rider that the men "stick to the job" which, it was explained, would mean that they would do as little work as possible to hold their position. The mine management practically no men back to work today. In line with the announcement yesterday that the various operating companies will no longer employ members of the I. W. W., it was decided to employ no more men without a thorough investigation.

The new residences abroad are as follows: Shanghai, China; Calcutta, India; Singapore, Malaya; Mexico City, Mexico; Paris, France, and Copenhagen, Denmark. In addition there are also seven bishops to be elected, to fill existing vacancies. Vacancies in the United States which must be filled include Portland, Or., and Helena, Mont.
