

Due to the near-exhaustion of the present available state highway fund which are dependent upon the outcome of the measure proposing an increase of the road bond indebtedness of the state which is on the ballot for Frid day's election, only such new contracts as are absolutely necessary will be en-tored into at this time. This policy of the commission is reflected in the notoday by the department here whint covers the construction of 21.45 miles of paving, 18.5 miles of grading four wood truss spans and one overhead crossing. Of this contemplated work 19.85 miles of paving and 9.15 miles of grading are county jobs to be under the supervision of the state highway department.
