

Increase Rates Polk County Telephone Lines

Independence, Or., Aug. 13.—An increase in the telephone rates on the lines serving Dallas and Falls City has been ordered by the public service commission. This line is owned by the Willamette Telephone company, the same as the Independence and Monmouth system, where an increase was granted a few weeks ago. The new rates are identical with the rates placed in effect here, and there is likewise a 10 cent toll charge between Dallas and Falls City.
