

Two Athletic Freaks Brought to Surface At Seventh Olympiad

New York, Oct. 12.—The seventh Olympiad brought two athletic "freaks" to the surface.

One is Guillemot, the French distance runner, the other Frigerio, the Italian ped.

Of the two, Guillemot was perhaps the object of the most attention because of the ease and grace of his style of running and because of his build.

The Frenchman is a little fellow, is well knit together and has abnormally long legs for his type. He is barrel chested and has a very short neck. He runs with a freedom and grace that are as natural to him as the peculiar loping trot is to the timber wolf.

The peculiar features about Guillemot's running lies in the fact that he runs with his head thrust forward and takes a stride that is altogether out of proportion to his height. In winning the 5,000-meter run he simply ran away from his field. In the 10,000-meter final he was second to Nurmi, the sturdy Finn, but only because he had burned himself out in the qualifying event.

He gave Nurmi one of the most dogged races ever witnessed on any track in the 10,000-meter final keeping at the Finn's elbow almost all the way and hanging there like a Nemesis. It took a runner devoid of nerves and stolid as the sphinx to finish ahead of Guillemot in that race. Nurmi was the one runner in the world who could do it.

Many of the experts who studied Guillemot's style are of the opinion that he will burn himself out in a comparatively short time unless he specializes at one distance. In the Olympics he was in the 5,000 and 10,000-meter races and the Marathon. In the latter event he turned an ankle and had to be brought back to the stadium in a mobile.

Daylight Change Code Troubles Massachusetts

Boston, Oct. 12.—The State Department of Agriculture, which has been seeking the repeal of daylight saving, has bumped up against the fact that daylight saving will doubtless be with us for two more years at least.

The act "to restore to the citizens of Massachusetts the benefits of daylight saving," provides in section 2:

"At 2 o'clock of the last Sunday of March of each year, beginning with the year 1921, the standard time in this commonwealth shall be advanced one hour."

The only way in which the law can be altered or repealed is by act of Legislature. If the Legislature, either at the special session to be held in November or at the regular session in 1922, should repeal the law, the action of the Legislature can be halted by recourse to the initiative and referendum.

A petition under the I. and R. supported by 15,000 signers, would submit the Legislature's repeal act to the voters "at the next regular election," which will be held in 1922. Meanwhile, the daylight saving law would continue in operation.

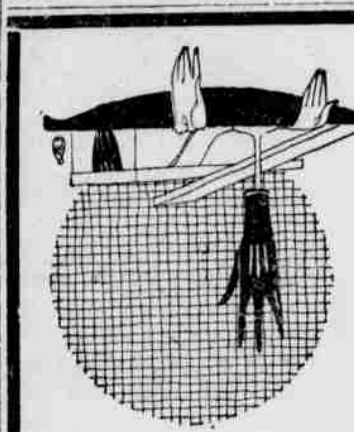
Vale.—Certain farmers in the region are rejoicing over the millet crop. Twelve tons to the acre were taken from a 20-acre field near here.

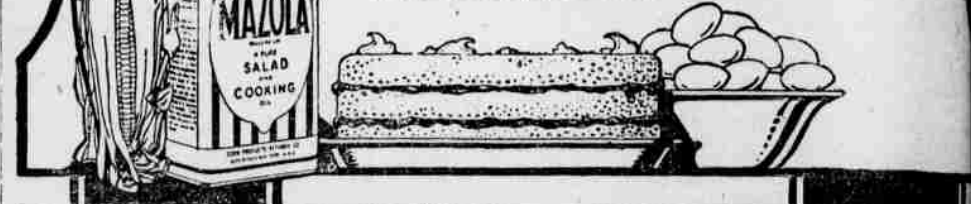

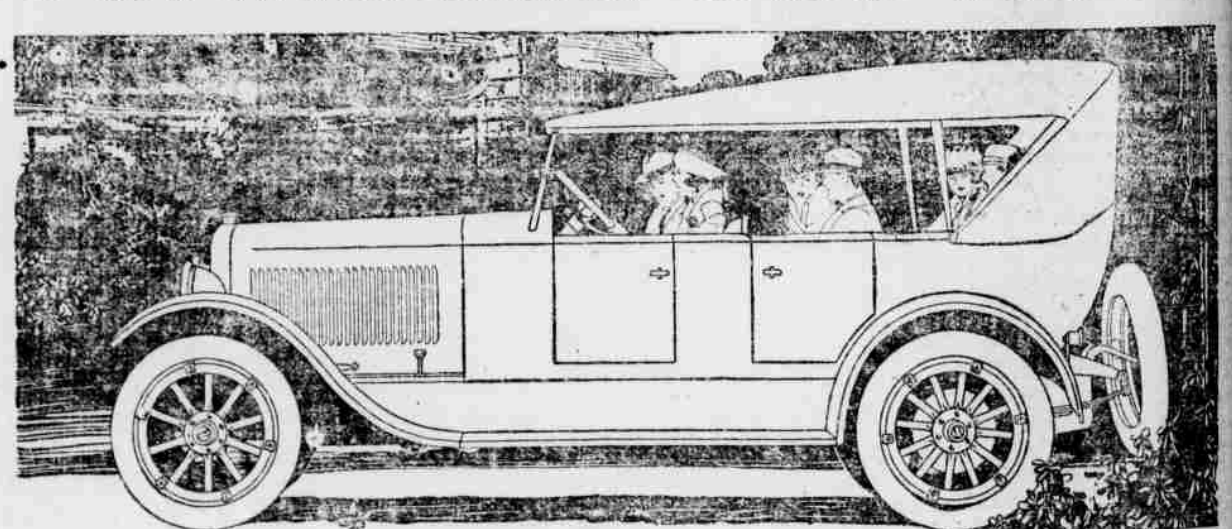
