Lowell of Fredonia, N. Y., master of the National Grange of the Patrons of Husbandry...

Growers Will Organize to Fix Prices Unless Better Returns Insured, Claim

"We are willing to have a fair understanding of values, the farmers receiving the same pay for the same hours work that others receive, no more, no less, but we feel that this is the last call," he said; "if no attention is paid to this now by bankers, manufacturers, railroads and labor organizations, and if the government continues to use its great power to import raw materials free of duty to reduce costs, then the grange will be the first to help organize nation-wide selling organizations which shall fix the price of farm products."

Equity Demanded

"There is no threat in this; we will have been driven to it in self-defense to preserve our agriculture," Mr. Lowell rejoiced that labor has been able to secure a much higher rate of wage, but added: "We little expected that they would turn and demand cheaper food from us without first ascertaining the cost of production, and thereby proving whether or not we were taking too large a margin of profit."
