 All proposals must be upon blank form to be obtained from Charles E. Martin, architect, at his office, 428-29 Railway Exchange Building, Portland, Oregon, and from R. B. Goodin, secretary of the Board, Salem, Oregon; must give the price proposed, Oregon State Board of Control, and must be signed by the bidder, with his address. Plans and specifications may be obtained at the office of R. B. Goodin, secretary, Oregon State Board of Control, Salem, and from the office of the aforesaid architect.
 Contractors will be required to deposit check for \$15.00 payable to the Oregon State Board of Control for each set of plans as a guarantee that said plans and specifications received by them will be returned to the office in good condition, on or before the date of the opening.
