## Court Mandate Frees Albers

Portland, Ore., July 21.—The mandate of the United States supreme court reversing the conviction of J. Henry Albers, retired miller, on charge of violation of the espionage act in war time by alleged disloyal remarks, was received here today. District Attorney Lester W. Humphreys said he would ask for a physical examination of Albers, who was recently reported stricken with paralysis to determine whether he could be brought into court for a retrial of the case. According to members of Albers' family and attendants, he suffered complete blindness and paralysis of the left side as a result of the stroke. His condition has not improved, they stated. Humphreys said he would not press the charges at this time if Albers was unable to appear in court.

New York, July 21.—The cost of production of an ice cream soda is 7 1/2 cents, a prominent pharmacist stated today in announcing that he could make a reasonable profit by charging the customer 10 cents. The cost is divided as follows: Syrup, one cent; milk, one cent; ice cream, two cents; labor, breakage, waste, etc., 3 1/2 cents.
