Governor-General Of Manchuria Has Armored Limosine

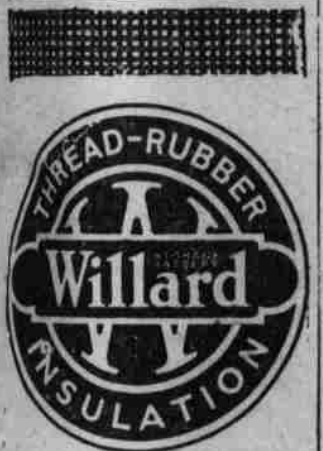
Revolutions may come and go but Tsan Tso-Lin, governor general of Manchuria, hopes to go on forever. He is an enthusiastic motorist and he does not intend to let his motoring be interfered with by any bombs, bullets or other obstacles put in his way by "reactionary radicals" or whatever they call the gentlemen in China who do not approve of wealth and authority and who express their disapproval in a manner which is crude but sometimes effective. And so the Manchurian governor has ordered a car not only fully armed and armored, but a Twin Six Limousine, magnificent in appearance, speedy, comfortable and powerful in performance.

Under its beautiful exterior finish there is an inner lining of chrome nickel steel. Shutters of the same material, concealed in the roof, may be lowered to cover the side windows. The shutters, to effect the curve formed by the top and sides of the carriage, are actually a number of steel plates cut into strips and fastened by means of flexible steel bands. The whole assembly operates on roller bearings.

New Device Has Number of Uses

Many functions are claimed for a device now on the market, the primary purpose of which is to supply a tool which does away with the ordinary lifting jack. It is attached to the felloe of the wheel by two pins and when it is desired to raise the wheel the car is driven over the device which then rests on the ground holding the wheel clear. It also may be used as a lock for the spare tire and as a traction device in mud or sand.

Protect Ignition Unit.
In washing the car or in driving through a heavy rain, great care must be exercised in preventing any water getting around the distributor cover to which the ignition wires are attached, which causes a short circuit. To overcome this, cut a piece about 12 inches long out of an old scrap inner tube and slip it over the distributor and wires and tape the top end tightly together. This makes it next to impossible to short circuit the ignition system at any time.

All windows in the body, as well as the windshield, are constructed of triple glass, which, if hit, is practically bullet proof.
To conform to the colors of Chinese royalty the cushions, seat backs and auxiliary seats are upholstered in purple and gold mo-

piece of 3-4 inch pipe. A slot should be cut in the bottom of the pipe so that it will hold the nut. 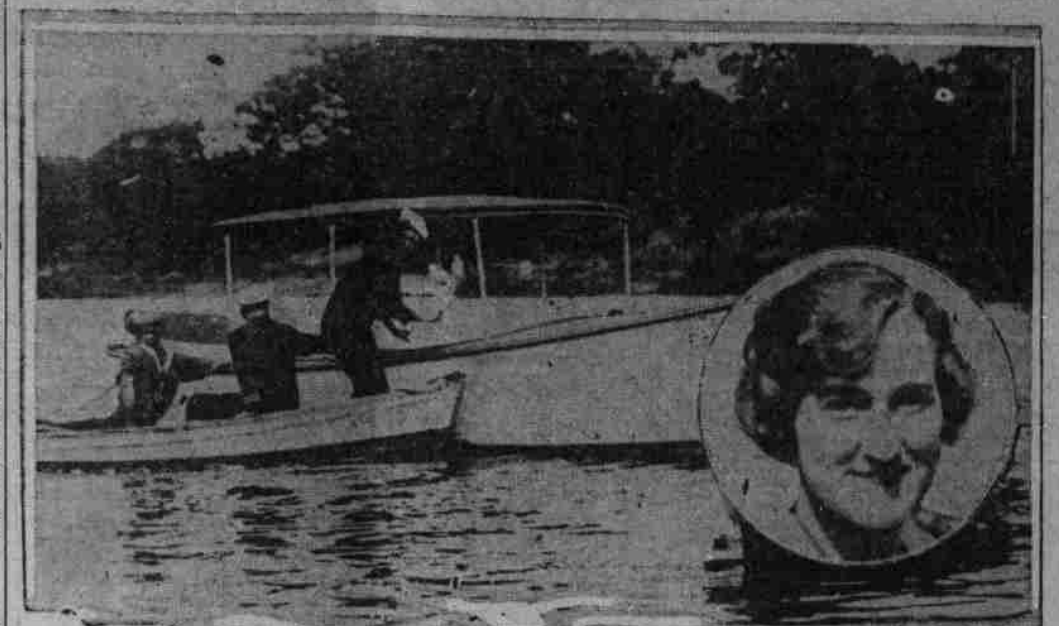
Jack Dempsey Takes to Skylarking

Bullet From Sky Which Wounded Girl Starts Probe



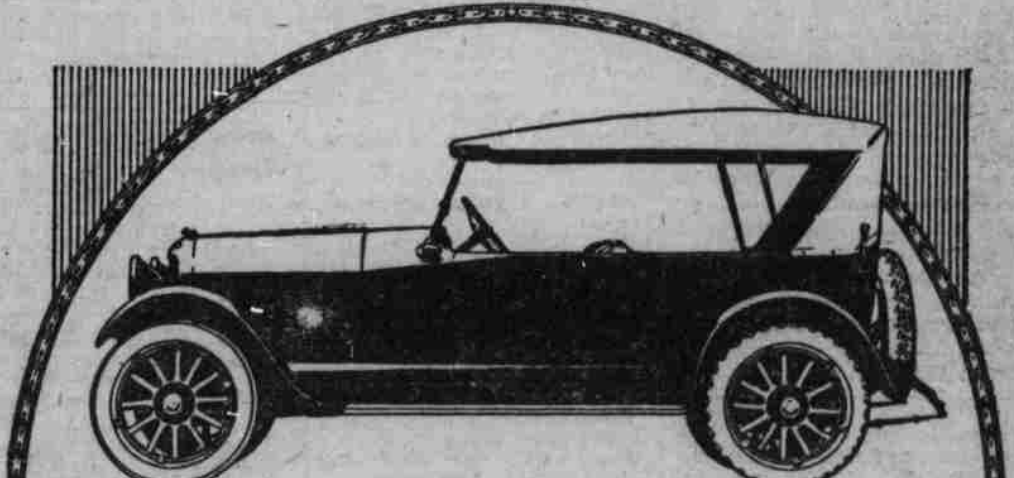
