Of Woerndle To Be Fought

Portland, Or., Sept. 14 .-- Con tinuation of proceedings to cancel the citizenship papers of Joseph Woerndle, alleged agent of the Austrian government during the war, was ordered yesterday by Attorney General Daugherty in a telegram to United States Attorney Humphreys, Mr. Humphreys started the pro-

eedings against Weerndle in April. In June he was directed by the attorney general to make a full report on the case, and the general impression was created that the demand for a full report on the case meant a discontinuance of any governmental effort to take away Woerudie's citizenship apers. German organizations in Portland and throughout the state passed resolutions lauding Woerndle for his "Americanism," while hundreds of telegrams from citizens and veterans' organizations have been directed to the department of justice calling for the continuation of the proceedings agalast Woerndle.

Before America entered the war, Woerndle was the local consul for the Austrian government. In 1917 Hans Boehm, an agent of the German government who was formerly an employe of the Arlington club in Portland, was arrested in England. He had in his pos session a passport bearing the name of J. LeRoy Thrusher. This pasport was found to have been forged. It also developed that in
