

Aggies Adopt Fight Slogan For Football

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Sept. 21.—"Sixty minutes of fight" is the slogan which will lead Coach "Dick" Rutherford's "Fighting Aggies" through the coming football season. Last Thursday morning the Beaver eleven started training for the 1921 season. Thirty huskies responded to the first call to don the football togs.

The return of "Cog" Campbell and Loece to the college has been a great boost to the strength of the squad, according to reports from the coaching staff. Campbell was left tackle on the 1919 freshmen team. Loece played fullback on the famous 1915 team which defeated the Michigan Aggies. He is out for a tackle position.

Letter men who have reported for this year's squad are Captain "Gay" Powell, "Bob" Stewart, "Ted" Hayden, "Nite" Daigh, Murium McFadden, Harold McKenna, "Huskey" McKenna and Joe Kasperger. All of the men reported in fine condition, according to the coach.

Amory Gill and Ray Loughrey from the 1920 "rook" team are making strong bids for a regular place on the varsity. Gill is showing ability as a punter, and Loughrey is after a place on the right end of the line. Eugene Miller, star player from Long Beach, California high school, is out for the squad. He was in college last year, but did not turn out for freshman football.

The coaching staff for this year will be headed again by "Dick" Rutherford. He will be assisted by Guy L. Rutherford, Ralph O. Coleman, and Robert H. Hager. Clyde W. Hubbard, former O. A. C. end, will coach the rookies this year. "Dad" Butler, varsity trainer, promises to have the men in the best possible condition for the season.

The team is spending very little time on the fundamentals of the game. This work was covered in the spring training season. Real work is on the program for the Beaver "Huskies." Twenty-nine men have been admitted to the training table by the coach.

Engineer Sues City of Monmouth

Dallas, Or., Sept. 21.—Suits has just been entered by Samuel S. Huston, of the city of Portland, against the city of Monmouth for the collection of \$252.75, an alleged amount due Mr. Huston for his professional services as a civil engineer during the month of September, 1920, in preparing plans and specifications for the improvement of some of the streets in city of Monmouth.

The complaint alleges that he was retained by the city to prepare the plans and specifications and estimated cost of improvement and was to receive two and one-half per cent of the amount of the improvement. The work was to have been done but was never consummated and the city has ignored his request for payment. He, therefore, brings suit to recover the amount.

State Guarantee of Interest On Bonds Extended

The state irrigation securities commission, at a meeting Monday afternoon, granted an extension of time on its guarantee of interest payments on \$1,350,000 in bonds of the Ochoco irrigation district. The extension is for one year on \$250,000 of the bonds and for six months on the remainder of the issue.

Interest guarantee on \$100,000 in bonds of the Slide irrigation district in Malheur county was also voted by the commission at Monday's session.

Peace Parley Status Still Undetermined

London, Sept. 20.—Premier Lloyd-George had before him today at Carlisle, Scotland, the Sinn Fein suggestion that representatives of the British cabinet meet Sinn Fein delegates in conference untrammelled by conditions. The latest note between the prime minister and Eamonn DeValera, sent yesterday by the Irish leader to Mr. Lloyd-George, did not, however, except possibly by implication, withdraw the offending paragraph of the Sinn Fein note of September 12, in which the sovereignty of the Irish state was asserted and which led Mr. Lloyd-George to cancel invitation to a conference.

As viewed here, the latest Irish note was conciliatory in character and it seemed to place upon the prime minister the choice of holding a free conference, or insisting that southern Ireland formally express its allegiance to the crown.

Farm Bureau To Launch Drive For 1000 Polk Members

Dallas, Or., Sept. 21.—A great membership drive by the Oregon State Farm Bureau will be joined by the Polk county bureau. The goal set is to secure 1000 in Polk county, and, to do this, tentative plans are for a most intensive week of advertising, circularizing and personal solicitation.

The drive will be conducted as early in October as the plans can be matured, and will continue for seven days. It is believed that those in charge of the drive that it will be possible to get more than 1000 members in Polk county. At least this number is needed if the organization, which is in need of greater support in its efforts to secure agrarian legislation in Washington.

Tokio, Sept. 21.—That Japan may improve her chances for the exploitation of the great desert of North China, Tokio politicians are fostering a plan to bring the son of the Living Buddha of Mongolia to Japan.

New York Sale of "Slaves" Halted; Ledoux Tries Again

New York, Sept. 20.—Urban Ledoux, whose attempt to sell the services of unemployed at auction last night was blocked by the police, today distributed meal tickets to forty hungry followers and announced he would march to Bryant Park and again try to hold his auction. He also distributed newspapers containing accounts of police activities yesterday, to thousands of jobless men.

Ledoux claimed he had dispersed large numbers of unemployed, fearing an outbreak of violence, as an aftermath of the clashes of yesterday when police rapped heads with their clubs and dispersed crowds that gathered to hear him. He declared that by feeding the jobless he believed he was keeping them from becoming violent.

Good Horses And Riders To Feature Fair

The might horse show in connection with the forthcoming state fair, is to present in show formation, some of the finest riding horses of the Northwest, as well as several other sections of the country. Outstanding will be the McCleave string from Victoria, B. C. Miss Dorie McCleave, who proved to be one of the cleverest riders of last year's show, will again be entered in the equestrian contest.

She will show one of the best educated high-school horses in country, putting him through the usual paces of schooled horses, including dancing in time with music and several special stunts that no other horse does.

The McCleave stable will also be represented in a brilliant jumping stunt, that is unique and sensational.

The Corinthian on Thursday night will be a new feature in Salem. This event calls for six jumps, three of them being hurdles of timber and brush four feet high, one post and one rail jump of four feet and a "pig pen," sixteen feet square. The latter proves the stumbling block to most horses. The ideal performance is to take the pig pen at such a rate of speed that the horse lands clearly in the middle of the enclosure and clears it at the next jump. Unless everything is figured accurately the horse is forced to take an extra jump in the pen, which lands him on the fence, or so close to the farther side that he cannot get out cleanly. Refusals and "spills" are a frequent incident of the "pig pen."

The water jump calls for the same hurdles, except that the last one is made to imitate hedge and ditch jump of about ten feet from the "take off" to the landing place. The water must be entirely cleared to make a perfect score.

Probably the most thrilling of all the jumps to be seen at the Salem show is the table jump in the Handy Hunter jumping class. The last jump in this event is a table with a bench on either side, with a dummy figure of a red-coated soldier lying on the table. Both the nature of the jump and the vivid coloring of the obstacles are such that only the best-motivated horses can be persuaded to make the attempt. Only one horse made the record at the Vancouver, B. C., horse show last month.

Five horses will be shown at Salem from the Skinner show stables of New York, including a jumper, three and five-gaited saddlers, a high-stepper and a great Harvester, standard-bred roadster, "Comet" 16 1/2 hands in height. The Skinner stables are known all over the horse show world. The same horses to be seen here have been shipped to horse shows in England three times. "Flash" the jumper was beaten by one horse in the world's championship high-jumping contest in London. His record is six feet, seven inches.

Roseburg Denied Crossing Right

Declaring that there are other available and more natural sites in the immediate vicinity for the construction of a bridge that would serve the public and protect the public health and safety, the public service commission, an order issued Tuesday, denied to the city of Roseburg the right to construct a grade crossing over the tracks of the Southern Pacific company at what is known as the Old Alexander bridge site.

As a solution to the crossing problem, which is admittedly of vital interest to Roseburg, the commission expresses its approval of plans prepared by the state highway commission for a combined bridge and overhead crossing to connect with Evans park at a point just south of Roseburg.

Another order issued by the commission Tuesday denies an application filed by the county court of Douglas county for permission to establish a grade crossing over the tracks of the Oregon & California Railroad company at Cornutt.
