

NEW YORK CENTER OF DRUG RING

City Remains Clearing House of Vendors Despite Activity of Federal Agents

New York, Nov. 9.—Notwithstanding the huge quantities of drugs—cocaine, morphine, heroin and opium—seized within the last six months, New York city still remains the clearing house of the rest of the country, according to Dr. Carleton Simon, special deputy police commissioner.

Dr. Simon declared that while smuggling of drugs through border towns and other ports has diminished, it continues into the port of New York from European countries, chiefly Germany.

A "deck" of heroin—ones "shot"—sells on the street from \$1.50 to \$2, depending upon the locality. The deputy commissioner said drug peddlers average \$5 per day from each addict.

"We have deprived the smugglers of the income from 2700 drug victims, which means \$12,500 daily," said Dr. Simon. "But there are still 20,000 drug addicts at large in this city. They represent to the dealers an income of \$100,000 daily. These do not include the 'legitimate drug users,' addicts who are being treated for the drug habit by their physicians. The narcotic squad does not interfere with doctors or their patients."

"But our object is not to get the drug victims. We want to break up the smuggling ring that is mauling these poor unfortunates for all they will pay. The federal authorities are working with us, and our agents are in Europe watching activities of drug sellers there. We have a complete record of every drug user arrested here with Bertillon photographs and a criminal record. Similar records for over 300 cities throughout the

New Oil Section Found In Mexico

Mexico City, Mex., Nov. 9.—An important new oil section has been found, according to reports received here, at Chilcoy, a point on the railroad to Monterey, about twenty miles north of Tampico. Oil, it is said, has been found at a depth of 1500 feet, making the drilling of wells much less expensive than in the other field adjacent to Tampico.

A number of new wells have been brought in at Chilcoy and early reports indicate that the field may be great enough to take the place of the areas in other sections which have felt the encroachment of salt water.

Hungary Bars Hapsburgs From Right To Throne

Budapest, Nov. 9.—It is understood that the government has issued a declaration that members of the Hapsburg family cannot be elected to the throne of Hungary. This declaration, made to satisfy the demands of the powers, is to be submitted to the national assembly for ratification as the official interpretation of the act passed by that body Sunday de-throning former Emperor Charles and ousting the entire Hapsburg dynasty.

Charles and his wife were last reported at Galatz, Rumania where they were taken on a special train to meet the British cruiser Cardiff, which is to transport them to their place of exile on the island of Madeira. The Cardiff reached Galatz Sunday.

City Clock on a Spree

Bellaire, Ohio, Nov. 9.—The city clock on the Central school building here ran wild recently.
