their crimes; others may have un-
 reasonably delayed their punish-
 ment; but none of these condi-
 tions, nor all of them together, can
 excuse the court in denying to a
 human being upon trial for his life
 or for his liberty, the right to a
 fair and impartial trial," the opin-
 ion reads. "In weighing the test-
 many of the witnesses, the jury are
 entitled to know the hostile feel-
 ings, if any, that the witnesses en-
 tertain for the defendant, in order
 to consider what motives may
 have actuated such witnesses to
 shade, color or to give false testi-
 mony."
