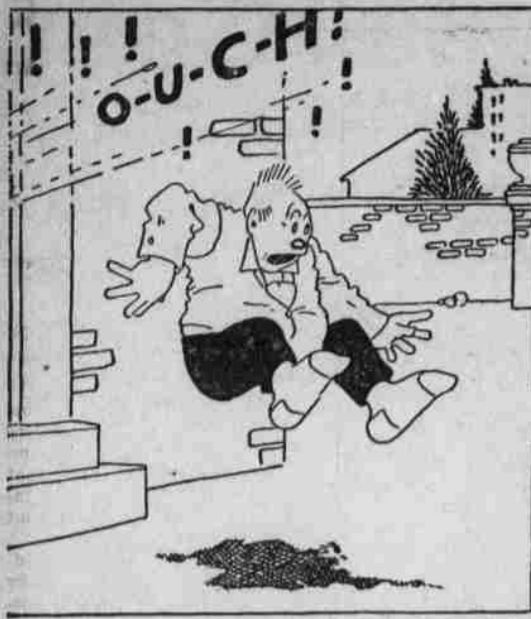

One hundred and eight mills reporting to West Coast Lumbermen's association for the week ending November 26, manufactured 59,577 feet of lumber; sold, 56,644,824 feet; and shipped, 52,286,397 feet.

Mrs. Kate Pringle Miller thus describes to Fred Lockley, in the Oregon Journal, an early hanging in Salem: "Grandfather Pringle ran a shoe shop and mended shoes at Salem during the winter of 1846-47. The next spring he took a place in the Waldo hills. Wait a moment. I will show you the old stem winding silver watch he traded his place in the Waldo hills for."
