## Local Briefs

Kiwanians will do honor to Benjamin Franklin at the regular weekly luncheon to be held in the Commercial club tomorrow. Father Buck will be the speaker and a program befitting the occasion of "Thrift Week" which opens here tomorrow is being planned.

The \$200,000 bond issue of the county for the improvement of market roads, bids for which were opened recently, was delivered to the highest bidders, Ladd & Tilton, bankers of Portland, by County Treasurer Drager this morning. The bank firm is supposed to have bought the bonds for eastern people.

An automobile, abandoned, which had been picked up by the police Saturday, yesterday was claimed by Herbert Stiff, Salem furniture dealer. The machine was found at 374 North Summer street.




