

SEMENOFF HELD FOR DESTRUCTION DONE BY FORCES

New York, April 5.—General Grigorie Semenov, leader of Russian Cossacks, today arrived in one of the city's best hotels. Instead of jail, where it seemed for several hours last evening he would be the city's guest. He was arrested at the instance of the receiver of an American company trading in Russia, who had sought to enforce the payment of a judgment of \$475,000 awarded against him in Harbin, Manchuria, last December.

Semenov, whose favorite title is "Ataman of the Cossacks," was permitted to go to the Waldorf, where he and his young wife had made reservations, and was there held under guard until nearly midnight. In the meantime friends had been hurrying and telephoning all over the city and they at last secured the \$25,000 held demanded by Sheriff Hays.

Claims upon which the judgment in the case was rendered allege that Semenov and his forces plundered in 1919 at or near Orlan, Trans-Baikalia, stores belonging to the Kouravitsa house and foreign trading company, a New York corporation. It was contended during the trial at Harbin that Semenov had not been recognized by any government and that therefore he was personally responsible for the property seized. The general claimed last night that he was seized by the allies and that from September 2, 1919, until April 1, 1921, he was a commander of United States forces in eastern Siberia.
