

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS IN 1921 VALUED AT 12 BILLIONS

Washington, April 21.—The gross wealth produced by farmers in 1921 had a value of \$12,366,000,000, or about two-thirds of the aggregate value of the farm products of 1920 and little more than one-half the aggregate for 1919, the department of agriculture estimated today. During the same period, 1919-21, production of ten crops which represent about 95 per cent of the total crop acreage fell 8 per cent.

The total value of crops, the department said, declined from \$15,423,000,000 in 1919 to \$10,909,000,000 in 1920 and to \$7,028,000,000 in 1921. The decline of the total value of animal products on the farm was from \$8,361,000,000 in 1919 to \$7,454,000,000 in 1920 and to \$5,339,000,000 in 1921.

Four crops of 1921 together had a value greater than one-half of the total value of all crops for that year. Corn was valued at \$1,303,000,000, or 18.5 of the total; hay and forage \$1,165,000,000 or 16.6 per cent; cotton lint and seeds \$755,000,000 or 10.7 per cent; wheat \$735,000,000 or 10.5 per cent, and the four crops \$3,960,000,000 or 56.3 per cent.

Several groups of crops are prominent, the department added. The cereals \$2,563,000,000 or 36.5

per cent of the crop total; the vegetables, including potatoes and sweet potatoes, \$1,104,000,000, or 16.7 per cent; fruit and fruit products, \$525,000,000 or 7.5 per cent and fruit and vegetables together, \$1,629,000,000, or 23.2 per cent.

Of the total value of animal products in 1921, the dairy products were nearly one-half, \$2,410,000,000 or 45.1 per cent; animals raised \$1,937,000,000 or 36.4 per cent, and the poultry raised and eggs produced \$843,000,000 or 17.7 per cent.

BLOSSOM DAY IS CHANGED; MAY 7

Due to weather conditions the date for Salem's annual Blossom day has been changed from April 23 to May 7, two weeks later, according to William McGilchrist, King Bing of the Cherries who are sponsoring the event.

The late spring has prevented the blossoms on a number of the fruit trees from coming out, which is good for the fruit but makes the time of blossom uncertain.

MILLION ASKED TO FIGHT FLOOD

Washington, April 21.—An emergency appropriation of \$1,000,000 to fight the flood waters now going south on the Mississippi river, will be asked of congress today by southern leaders with the approval of Budget Director Dawes. A joint resolution carrying this amount will be offered in the house today, it was announced today by Representative Wilson of Louisiana and Humphreys of Mississippi.

Appeal for Food.
Washington, April 21.—Appeals for rations for families rendered destitute by the flood were received today by the treasury from Naples and Mercedosa, Illinois. The matter is being taken up with the war department, officials said, as it is expected the quartermaster's corps would have charge of any distribution of government rations in the flood areas.

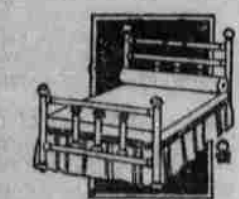

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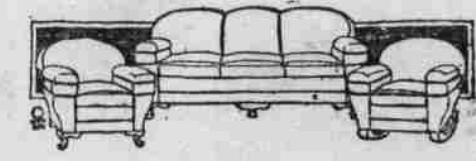
