UNDER STRIKE CONDITIONS BEST EXPLAINED BY CHAIRMAN RENE W. HOOPER OF THE BOARD OF RAILROAD LABOR BOARD IN HIS STATEMENT OF JULY 1ST, READING AS FOLLOWS:
