

LAST PROGRAM OF CHAUTAUQUA HEARD BY MANY

The last engagement of the Chautauqua was given last night by the Gillevan Opera company, a quartet of metropolitan opera stars. The program was divided into two parts, the first given to the singing of grand opera pieces, and the second to the rendition of "Ruddycore." The selection given during the first part of the program which was most enjoyed was the sextette from Lucie di Lammermoor which had been arranged for four voices. Other selections greatly appreciated were "The Merry Miller" from the opera "Rob Roy."

The rendition of "Ruddycore" as a part of the program was a feast for the music lovers. The opera originally required 17 characters but had been arranged so that practically the whole of the story was given by the quartet. The Hungarian rhapsody was rendered with perfect technique as the first part of the opera. Much of the piece was spoiled for the audience by the puffing of a freight engine which was switching just across the mill creek.

Although there was deficit at the end of the season this year, C. E. Wilson, director of the Chautauqua, stated that he had received enough pledges to practically make sure the week's entertainment for next year. Nearly half the amount necessary to cover the guarantee has been pledged by persons who will take tickets next year. Backed by this and the knowledge that never before was there a deficit in Salem there is but little doubt that a contract for next year will be signed soon.

FORMER STATE SENATOR DEAD

Hugo von der Hellen of Medford, a member of the board of regents of the Oregon Agricultural college for the past 13 years, who served two terms each in the state senate and in the house of representatives from Jackson county and was one of the most popular members of the legislature, passed away at the Portland Surgical hospital last night following six weeks' treatment for an organic disorder. A merciful unconsciousness for the last hours permitted no pain and the end came peacefully as sleep. His wife and son, George, were at his bedside. The funeral will be held Friday or Saturday from Medford.

Senator von der Hellen was born in Denmark, where his father was consul-general for Germany, and educated both in Germany and England. For years he had charge of large tea plantations in Burma and India, coming to Oregon about 30 years ago, settling at Wellen, Jackson county, where he had extensive holdings. He was about 75 years of age. Courty and polished manners and a fine presence made him typical of the old school and gave him many friends in Salem.

ATTEMPT TO MURDER RUSS ENVOYS RUMORED

London, July 6.—A rumor that an attempt had been made to assassinate the Russian delegates to The Hague conference caused considerable excitement in the Dutch capital this morning, says an Exchange Telegraph dispatch. There was no confirmation of the report up to noon.

Both the police and the Russian delegation at The Hague denied that any attempt at assassination was made.

The report probably grew out of the action of the police in turning back from the Dutch frontier fifteen Russians said to be monarchists, who were traveling under false passports.

HECKER DRESSED IN AT PEN; APPEARS CALM

Russell Hecker, condemned to hang September 22 for the murder of Frank Bowker, entered a cell in murderer's row at the state prison here at 4:30 o'clock Wednesday afternoon. Hecker was accompanied to Salem by Sheriff Wilson of Clackamas county who reported an uneventful trip.

Hecker was calm and outwardly composed as he entered the prison but declared that he had no statement to make at this time. The new arrival increases the population of murderer's row at the prison to seven, with the eighth, Dan Casey, now in Portland.

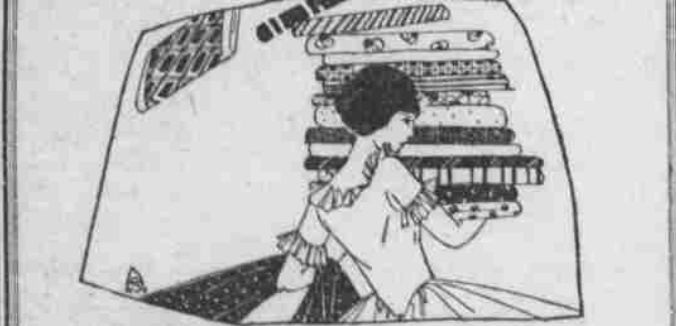
