

### 247,996 PATROL MILES COVERED BY SPEED COPS

A total of 247,996 patrol miles were covered by the operatives of the state traffic department during 1923, according to the annual report filed with the secretary of state here by T. A. Rafferty, chief state traffic inspector, and total activities for the year numbered 25,327. The regular number of traffic officers for the year was 13, though at times as many as 17 were employed.

Other important statistics in the report covering the year's work are:

Delinquent automobile license fees collected, \$33,429.63; fines imposed as a result of arrests by operatives of the department, \$28,751.15; value of stolen cars recovered, \$16,300; motor vehicle license fees collected from cars registered in other states, and whose owners have established residences in Oregon, \$667.75; total amount of revenue for which credit is claimed by the department, \$88,158.52.

Warnings or notice of violation slips to the number of 9556 were issued to motor vehicle operators who were observed violating the law in some minor degree. The total arrests for the year numbered 1576, fewer in number by almost 200 than during the previous year.

During the period from August 1, 1920, when the department became operative, a period of three years and five months, 4135 arrests have been made, 26,322 warnings issued, 496,112 patrol miles covered, stolen cars recovered to the value of \$38,770, and delinquent license fees collected and fines imposed totaling \$179,885.98. It is believed a profit in excess of \$50,000 can be shown.

### THREE PRESIDENTS FOR HONDURAS

San Salvador, Republic of Salvador, Feb. 21.—Honduras has now three proclaimed "presidents" according to dispatches received here.

The first is Dr. Juan Angel Arias the liberal candidate, to whom former President Rafael Gutierrez is said to have handed the reins of office.

The second is General Tiburcio Carias, who recently proclaimed himself de facto head of the government, but whose forces since were said to have met with serious reverses.

The third is Policarpo Bonilla, who is supported by Generals Gregorio Ferrera and Vicente Tosta Ferrera and Tosta are said to be making progress and are expected to have reached San Pedro, in Sula.

New York, Feb. 21.—Thomas R. Felder, the attorney who yesterday was attacked in the senate by Senator Wheeler of Montana in connection with remarks about Attorney General Daugherty, has challenged the senator to repeat his statements after foregoing senatorial immunity.

Senator Wheeler's statement that "the newspapers in New York carried the details of how the attorney general's former partner, and friends, Mr. Felder, was collecting money for the purpose of selling offices and appointments and for the dismissal of the whiskey cases in the city of New York" was read to Mr. Felder, and he issued the following statement:

"There is not a word of truth in Senator Wheeler's ridiculous charges against me except that I was Mr. Daugherty's former friend. I am his friend today. I was never his partner. We were associated in many cases in former years, but since he became attorney general, I have never accepted any employment from any client in any matter that originated in the department of justice."
