ment, the bill goes over much of
the ground covered in the senate
investigation.
It recites that President Hard-
ing was without authority to
"representations from Fall," who
in the interest of the United States
but to the advantage, profit and
benefit of the Mammoth Oil com-
pany and in "particular, Harry F.
Sinclair."
Fall, the bill charges, knew at
the time that the whole transac-
tion was illegal.
Evidence of the alleged conspir-
acy, the government's bill charges,
is found in the fact that the agree-
ment was made in secret by private
negotiation "without adver-
tisement of competitive bidding,"
and that prospective bidders were
discouraged from bidding and de-
clined the opportunity by Fall. The
Texas company, the Pioneer Oil
company, Edward L. Doheny and
Leo A. Stack, the bill says, were
among those so excluded. At the
same time, the government
charges "Fall steadfastly refused
to take the question of law officers
of the government on the legality
of the proposal."
Claims Worthless
Fall, furthermore, the govern-
ment charges, "secretly communi-
cated" to Sinclair that he would
not make any leases until Sinclair
produced "quit claim deeds to any
claims within the lands, knowing
well that said claims were worth-
less."
Then, the bill charges, Fall "by
connivance," arranged for Sinclair
to acquire such quit claims from
the Pioneer Oil company, "with in-
tent to stifle competition."
At the same time, it is recited,
Fall agreed with John C. Shaffer,
newspaper publisher, to see that
Sinclair get certain of the oil
leased lands for "the benefit of the
said Shaffer."
