INTEREST OF SCHOOL FUND SHOWS GAIN
 (Continued from Page One.)
 and the full amount, \$391,263.04 or \$1.64 per capita for all of the school children in the state, is now in the hands of the county school superintendents and will be distributed on November 1, as it also provided by law.
 To go further into the facts regarding the true status of the railroad school fund and the charges being hurled by the governor and the Oregon Journal, one will discover from the records of the land board that not only are the investments of the school fund in farming lands holding their own in earning capacity, but that the interest payments for the land board's fiscal year, ending July 31, 1924, were greater by approximately \$2,000 than for the previous year.
 A statement of the fund's interest earnings for the period from August 1, 1923, to July 31, 1924, shows the receipts to be \$405,187.84. The preceding year showed receipts totaling \$403,331.74.
 Interest Greater
 Considering that agriculture generally has during the past two years been passing through a serious period of depression and farmers have almost without exception been totally without ready money, it is hard to infer from the foregoing figures that the irreducible school fund is in such danger of radical depletion as the governor and the Journal would believe. Particularly is this so when it is considered that the interest receipts for August and September of this year were \$26,199.72 and \$11,294.88, respectively, as against corresponding figures of \$27,430.18 and \$30,752.44 for the same months in 1923.
 Without exception the interest receipts on school fund loans for the past three years have been and are measuring fully up to the average for each month, in spite of the fact that the farmers, by Governor Pierce's own admission, have been so hard pressed for ready money that they could scarcely meet their taxes.
 LA FOLLETTE ASKS REPEAL RAILROAD ACT

 freight rates until this is done, charged that the railroad interest is engaged actively "in a desperate effort" to defeat him and elect either Coolidge or Davis and insisted that he did not propose, if elected, to undertake an ill-considered experiment in public ownership of railroads or along any other line.
 Declaring that countless laws have been passed to deal with the proven and admitted evils of the transportation system but even the best of them have not gone to the root of the trouble, Mr. La Follette contended that the only way to take the railroad out of politics is to repeal it.
 "Every half way measure that does not establish a principle, every futile compromise merely aggravates the situation," he continued. "The progressives propose to go to the very heart of the problem and to deal with it on a scientific and constructive basis. They are not interested in patching up bad laws or in enacting new measures designed only to fool the people."
 "Before the progressive can proceed with their constructive program, however, it is necessary to wipe off the statute books a law that is destructive to business and agriculture, and unbearable burdensome to the entire consuming population."
 Must Be Repealed
 "The Esch-Cummins railroad law must be repealed. This post-war charter of special privilege must be revoked. Upon this immediate issue there is a complete divergence between the progressive candidates and their opponents in the republican and democratic parties. Mr. Davis stands for the retention of this law and President Coolidge, in his first message to congress, threatened to veto any modification of its principal provision. He is today contending against the repeal of this law, universally condemned by the American people as a law whose only friends are the railroad owners and those who serve them. He has also given his sanction to the most extravagant claims of the railroads."
 Senator La Follette told his audience that "the railroads, through their propagandists are spreading the statement that the election of the progressives will destroy the railroads and injure business."
 Contemplate No Injury
 "That statement is utterly false," he declared. "The progressives are not going to injure the property of the railroads. They never have. You can go up to Wisconsin and find out how the railroads have fared under progressive control in all the years that the railroads have been regulated in Wisconsin, and they have been regulated more fairly and upon a more scientific basis than in any state in the Union."
 "The progressives do not believe that a single dollar of the property of the railroads, but they are determined that the railroads shall no longer be permitted to confiscate the property of the people."
