

LOGGING ROAD TO TAP BIG AREA OF VALLEY TIMBER

The Eastern & Western Lumber company of Portland has contracted for the construction of 21 miles of standard logging railroad from Molalla, on the Willamette Valley Southern railway, into the heart of the lumber company's timber holdings in the southern part of Clackamas county, according to recent announcement.

According to F. H. Ransom, manager of the timber company, the new road will open up a tract containing about 1,000,000,000 board feet of lumber. It is the plan of the company to bring the logs to a dumping and rafting site on the east bank of the Willamette river from where they will be floated to the company mill at Portland. This mill, located at the foot of Twenty-first street, has been equipped for electrical operation and will be able to handle 1,000,000 feet of logs each year. Estimates are that two years will be required to build the new logging road. Its connection with the Willamette valley Southern will again place this road upon a paying basis after several years in which it has not paid appreciable dividends. The construction bonds of the Willamette Valley Southern line are guaranteed by the Portland Electric Power company, which was facing the necessity of either making up dividends or scrapping the line.

SILVER DOLLARS SAVE MILLION OVER BILLS

Boston, Mass., Nov. 21.—Use of the silver dollar in place of bills will save the government \$1,000,000 a year, assistant Secretary of the Treasury Charles D. Dewey, said last night in an address at the second annual conference of New England banks that are members of the federal reserve bank.

To the \$4,000,000 cart wheels now in circulation, the treasury department desires to add \$30,000,000 in this country and \$13,000,000 in the insular possessions he added. Since it costs only one cent to mint a silver dollar and 1.7 cents to make a \$1 bill, Mr. Dewey explained that a tremendous saving could be effected if the plan were accepted by the public.

NECESSITY FOR SAFE GUARDING OF FISH SUPPLY

Washington, Nov. 21.—Commissioner Henry O'Malley made his annual report to Secretary Hoover today covering the work of the bureau of fisheries in the department of commerce for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1924. The report discloses the critical condition of many of our important fisheries, the inability of these branches to meet the heavily increased demands for service, and the interest of the American people in having these fisheries rehabilitated that they may serve to the fullest extent as a source of food and recreation without endangering the future supply.

Growing interest of the people in the various problems of the fisheries is reflected, Mr. O'Malley reports. In the increased attention given to them by congress, which during the past year adopted four major measures sponsored by Secretary Hoover. These measures provide for conservation of the Alaskan salmon, protection of the Pacific halibut fisheries, reservation of the streams of the upper Mississippi for the breeding of fish and game, and control of oil pollution of coastal waters by oil burning and oil carrying ships.

Pollution, deforestation, reclamation and irrigation projects, power dams and other obstructions to the free movement of fish to the spawning areas and other factors have seriously depleted the supply of aquatic life, especially in our interior and coastal waters, and created conditions that make it extremely difficult for the natural supply to be properly maintained, says the commissioner in his report.

1357 FAILED TO VOTE IN POLK REGISTRATION

Dallas, Or., Nov. 21.—After a check of the registration books of the county with the poll books for the past two years County Clerk Floyd D. Moore has found that a total of 1357 registered voters in Polk county have not voted in that time. This number is out of a total registration of approximately 7000.

Those who have been non-voters in that period will be notified by card and if they are not heard from their registration will cease. 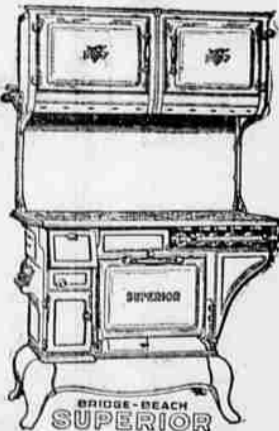
