

MYERS SPENT \$544 IN RACE FOR TREASURER

Jefferson Myers, unsuccessful democratic candidate for state treasurer, has filed with the secretary of state a campaign expense statement showing that he personally expended \$544 in the race for treasurer. Elton Watkins and Walter J. Hembree, unsuccessful democratic candidates for congress from the third district and for secretary of state, respectively, report expenditures of \$715.16 and \$296.74. F. C. Whittier, treasurer of the democratic state central committee, reports an expenditure of \$3553.02 in support of democratic candidates. Will T. Kirk of Portland spent \$100 in opposition to the workmen's compulsory compensation bill.

THREE DEAD IN SPOKANE TRAGEDY

Spokane, Wash., Nov. 21.—A triple killing, supposed to have occurred yesterday was disclosed by the police here today when the bodies of George Howard, aged 24, and Mrs. Carrie MacMackin, 35, were found in a rooming house, and the body of Howard's wife, aged 29, was found in a hotel room. All are negroes.

Howard, who was separated from his wife called at her hotel yesterday the proprietor said, and left when informed she was not in. His body and that of Mrs. MacMackin who also was said to have been separated from her husband was found when numerous telephone calls for them at the rooming house attracted the suspicion of the landlord toward Howard's room. Afterward police sought Howard's wife and discovered her body.

The officers believe Howard killed his wife and then Mrs. Mackin and himself.
