SALEM HIGH AND BEARCAT BABES CLASH TONIGHT

The Salem high school basketball team will clash in their annual battle tonight on the high school floor. The game was originally scheduled for the Willamette floor but as there is no heat in the Willamette gymnasium it was changed to the high school.

A hard battle is promised for the red and black as Leslie Sparks has a good team. The freshmen defeated the Chemawa Indians by a 22 to 11 score while Salem lost to the same team by one point. According to comparative scores the babes ought to win, but Salem played a different team in the Indians than the freshmen did. The high school should have won the Indians game but failure to get started until late and to convert several free throws caused the locals to fall behind.

Salem will have a battle on its hands but are determined to mark a win against the freshmen and ought to win unless something radically wrong happens. The only way the babes won was by getting behind the Indians defense which gave them several easy shots at the hoop. The high school has one of the best teams in years, with the exception of one guard. Patterson's place is as yet doubtful. Bob Drager has been filling it fairly well but he is green and does not get back on the defense as fast as he should. "Red" Lyons, who has been filling it at other times is faster than Drager but is also green and does not have the basketball head that Drager has. Huntington is trying to find someone who will be able to fill the position and thinks that he will have the team going at top speed when they officially meet next season.

The game will start at 7:30.

CHEMAWA QUINT IS EASY VICTOR

Chemawa, Or., Jan. 2.—The Chemawa Indians kept their good stride yesterday afternoon and won handily over the Anderson & Brown team on the former's floor by a 41 to 24 score. The teams were about even in the first quarter, but in the remaining three the Chemawa boys slipped out and displayed their real class.
