A large attendance of the parents of children attending the Parrish junior high school are expected to be in attendance at the meeting of the council this evening when the ordinance to require all motor vehicles to come to a full stop on Capitol street on either side of the school house comes up for final consideration.

The ordinance was introduced as an emergency measure at the last regular meeting of the council, but due to the press of other business and the fact that the Christmas holidays, with the school closed, was but a few days off, the matter was laid over until tonight.

While no strenuous public opposition to the proposal has yet been heard, there are rumors that passage of the ordinance will be fought, and the parents are expected to be on hand to stress the necessity of legislation that protects the children. The suggestion that the children be taught to watch for and dodge the traffic is not meeting with popular approval of the parents.

With two exceptions all prisoners indicted by the grand jury Saturday and arraigned before Judge Kelly today entered pleas of guilty.

William Harper, charged with assault with a dangerous weapon as a result of a fight at Detroit, Or., pleaded guilty. Thomas E. Brown, charged with forgery on several counts, will plead Thursday.

Don Morrison and John Chilcote pleaded guilty to the burglary of the Shaver hardware store and will receive sentence Thursday. Herb Brown pleaded guilty to the theft of wool and mohair from Roy King and will be sentenced Thursday. He presented a lengthy verbal statement to the court, pleading for leniency. Myron January pleaded guilty to forgery and was sentenced to serve up to two years in the state prison, but a bench parole is under consideration upon recommendation of the district attorney.

SEIZURE OF CANADIAN BOOZE SHIP HELD LEGAL

San Francisco, Jan. 5.—Seizure of the British steamer Quadra, with its reputed cargo of liquor valued at \$500,000 by the coast guard cutter Shawnee of San Francisco recently, "was legal in every way and the crew of the Quadra violated the law of the United States," United States District Judge John S. Partridge decided here today.
