MOTIONS ARGUED IN SUITS AGAINST FORD

Motion to have the case of the E. A. Mitchell tractor company against the Ford Motor Car company and Henry Ford and son for \$254,000 transferred to the federal courts, was argued before Judge Kelly, Monday, who took it under advisement, W. C. Winslow, attorney for the Mitchell company, fought the motion as he desires to secure service on Henry Ford and his son through the state courts before the case is transferred.

In the case of Tick Brothers for \$250,000 now in federal courts, the action was dismissed there against Henry Ford and son but not as to the Ford Motor Car company, Winslow stating that the method of getting service on Henry Ford and his son in the federal courts makes it almost impossible to secure such service and he desires to get it's service in the state courts before it reaches the federal courts in the present case.

GAS FIRES HOME IN ABSENCE OF FAMILY

Pittsburgh, Pa., Jan. 6.—Returning to their home in Wilkinsburg early this morning after spending the evening with relatives, Frank Dasta and family found their dwelling wrecked and in flames the result, police declared, of an explosion of gas.

The fire spread from the two-story frame house occupied by the Dasta family to the adjoining building on each side. The Dasta home was practically destroyed and the other two buildings badly damaged.

When neighbors failed to see any members of the Dasta family following the explosion, it was first feared that they had been trapped in the burning building. Firemen were making frantic efforts to penetrate the heavy smoke and flames when the family arrived on the scene. Fire officials estimated the damage at \$50,000.
