

### BRITISH SHIPS MARK PASSING OF DREADNAUGHTS

London, Jan. 10.—The designs of the battleships Nelson and Rodney, now being rebuilt by Great Britain under the provisions of the Washington naval treaty, is so revolutionary, according to the Daily Express, that it marks the end of the dreadnaught era, just as the dreadnaughts marked the end of previous types.

The new ships will be entirely different from any others in the world, the paper says. They will be both floating for tressors and airdromes and will have a radius of action covering thousands of miles. Nine 16 inch guns will be mounted in turrets of three each, all forward. There will be guns on the after part, which will constitute a flight deck, and the ships will carry their own flying corps and planes.

Another feature, the Express says, is that there probably will be no funnels, the products of the furnaces being discharged through pipes running alongside the stern. The distribution of the armor will also be revolutionary. The usual armor belt extending for three parts of the ship's length will be unnecessary, and the weight saved on the sides can be added to the deck protection against high fire and aerial bombs. There will also possibly be more than one armor deck, thus giving successive means of protection.

The treatment consists in cutting the nerve leading directly to the cancerous growth. According to Professor Molotoff, the new method plays a vital part in all cases of cancer. At the academy of medical sciences he exhibited several patients who, he said, had been cured by the new method. The same treatment, he asserts, will also heal gangrene and inflammation of the marrow of bones.

and left the hotel, coming back later with the \$1000. The Journal said he refused to say where he had left the \$1000 after departing from the hotel the first time, but added that young Davis asserted his father had no knowledge of the transaction. Says Son Intrigued  
Governor Davis said his son told him of the affair last night when he came home. "Some how they inveigled my son into accepting the money," he said; "but when he realized why they had given it to him, took it back to them. At the same time he delivered the pardon, which I had already decided to grant."

The governor said he had aided Pollman at his trial in 1921, and later had appealed to former Governor Henry Allen in Pollman's behalf. The governor's son could not be reached last night, his father stating he had retired. Pollman alleged he had been told by Glenn A. Davis, who was sentenced to life imprisonment for murder that Governor Davis solicited the payment of money to his son for executive clemency. Pollman had been active since his release from prison in behalf of Glenn Davis and had obtained, he said, several short term paroles for Glenn Davis.
