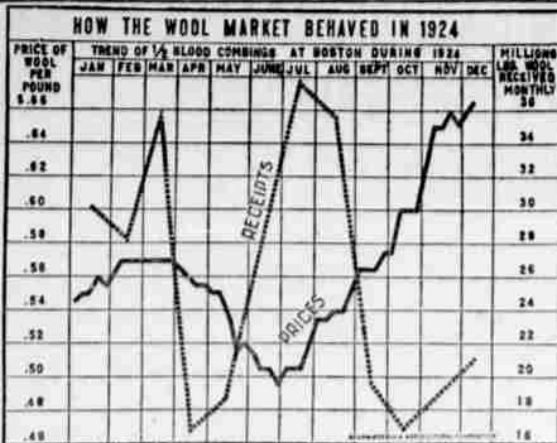


HIGH EGG PRICES TO BE EXPECTED FOR SOME TIME
