RUSSIANS HOPE FOR RECOGNITION WITH HUGHES OUT

Moscow, Jan. 15.—(By Associated Press.)—The resignation of Secretary Hughes and the suggestion in some American newspapers that his withdrawal presages a change in the American government's attitude toward soviet Russia have greatly heartened the bolshevik officials and press.

The belief is indulged in many quarters that Mr. Hughes' retirement was due directly to disagreement with President Coolidge and his colleagues over the recognition of the soviet and the prediction is freely made that one of the first acts of the new secretary, Frank B. Kellogg, will be in the direction of giving official countenance to the soviet regime.

FARM EXPORT CORPORATION IS RECOMMENDED

Chicago, Jan. 15.—Creation of a farmers' export corporation of 15 individuals with power to divert a surplus above domestic needs to the world market with adequate working capital, power to collect each commodity in amounts sufficient to prevent impairment of the working capital and a protective tariff have been recommended by the American Council of Agriculture to President Coolidge's agricultural council.

The suggested legislation, outlined by G. M. Peck, president of the council, provide that the incorporators be the secretaries of treasury, agriculture and commerce and 12 individuals appointed by the president, one from each of the federal land bank districts, from nominations made in the district by bona fide farm organization.

The incorporators would make up a board of directors with power to organize a smaller executive committee from the appointed members, to hire administrative officers and otherwise exercise a corporation's powers. It was proposed.
