TAX UPON GAS HIGHER; LICENSES SOME LOWER

The bill proposing a 40 per cent reduction in automobile license fees and substitution of a 5-cent per gallon tax on gasoline for the present 3-cent tax are approved in the report of a special committee named by Governor Pierce many months ago to study and recommend changes in the system of taxing automobiles. W. B. Dennis of Carlton is chairman of the committee.

The principle of car value is ignored in the report. Under the system proposed by the committee the proceeds of automobile licenses would be slightly reduced as compared with the present system, but this would be offset by higher licenses on commercial vehicles, a tax on the gross revenues of truck and bus lines and increases in some other fees.

One reduction of the committee is a reduction in license fees based on the number of registrations through which the car has passed. For each weight classification, except the first, less than 1700 pounds a basic license rate per 100 pounds of car weight is recommended. This basic license rate is named as \$1.50, \$1.30 and \$1.50, with deductions allowed for registration discount, so that the full license fee would be determined by multiplying the weight of the car by the discounted license rate per 100 pounds.

The arbitrary registration discounts are fixed as follows:

For each of the first four years of registration the same fee will be paid annually.

For the fifth, sixth and seventh registration a discount of 10 per cent from the regular fee would be allowed.

For the eighth, ninth and tenth registration a discount of 50 per cent is provided.

The following methods of increasing revenue are proposed:

Increase in dealer license plate fees from \$30 to \$50 and for additional sets an increase from \$5 to \$10.

Ten-dollar public service fee for supervision of motor buses would be abolished and in its place would be imposed a 2 per cent tax on gross revenues of buses operating between fixed termini. The present \$4 passenger tax would be abolished.

One per cent tax on the gross revenue of commercial trucks and abolition of 50-cent tax on each inch of tire width.

Transient buses and trucks would pay an additional tax equal to 100 per cent of their vehicle license.

SILVERTON BOND ISSUE FOR \$35,000 SUCCESSFUL

Silverton, Or., Jan. 19.—(Special.)—The Silverton bond election carried at Silverton, Saturday, with 353 votes for and 71 against. One defective vote was cast. The bond was for \$35,000 for the purpose of buying additional school grounds and building additional school rooms. Ten new rooms will be built, six to replace the ones by fire of the Emerson building and four additional rooms to alleviate the crowded conditions which were in existence even before the fire.

497 ACCIDENTS IN PAST WEEK REPORTED

A total of 497 accidents were reported to the state industrial accident commission for the week ending January 15, of which three were fatal. The fatal cases were: Daniel F. Corkey, Greenwood, car loader; John Swanson, North Bend, pile driver; Charles Van Vant, Oakridge, laborer. Of the total number of accidents reported 385 were subject to the provisions of the workmen's compensation act, 111 were from firms and corporations that are not under the act and one was from a public utility corporation not subject to the act.

REPORTS SALE OF FIVE USED CARS IN WEEK

R. N. MacDonald, Salem motor dealer, who is located at 254 State street, reports the sale of 5 used cars last week, which brings his record up to more than 1100 worth of automobile merchandise moved during the past 3 months.

Salem was a little bit handicapped by the floor as it was slick and they were unable to work the ball down to the basket as they have been doing. Heenan made a field goal in the first few minutes while Ellis converted a foul and Heenan connected with the hoop for two more baskets. Several times the locals lost the ball on the court of the slick floor but in the second half they were able to check the Silverton team and they held them to two points while they connected with the basket for a total of 23 points.

In the last quarter Huntington sent in a number of substitutes to give them a chance. They held Silverton scoreless while Nash and Hansen were able to find the basket. 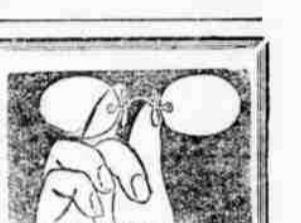
