STRAHORN DENIES SALE OF KLAMATH RAILROAD LINES

Portland, Jan. 22—Robert E. Strahorn, builder of the Oregon, California and Eastern railroad, which runs out of Klamath Falls, in a statement given out here last night denied rumors that he had sold the line. He declared the railroad situation in southern and south central Oregon may result in a "long drawn out fight between powerful railroad antagonists." Strahorn arrived here yesterday on business connected with his railroad. His statement follows:

"Having never relaxed in my determination to maintain such control of the Oregon, California and Eastern as would insure the development of central and southern Oregon in the most thorough manner as I see it, I still retain all the interest in it I have had for some years past, excepting as to some sales of its bonds to enable me to push ahead as I have been heretofore doing."

"It is impossible to say when the northern lines will enter Klamath Falls from Bend, if at all," said President W. F. Turner of the Oregon Trunk railroad this morning. "But we think it is to the city's interest not to grant exclusive franchises to any one railroad which would prevent entrance of other lines into the Klamath Falls district. The use of joint facilities is the order of the day."

GRANGE OPPOSES ABOLITION OF DRY SERVICE

The Marion county Pomona grange yesterday went on record against any legislation to abolish the state prohibition department or the state market agent's department. The organization also went on record in favor of the bills to place the justice of the peace and constable of the Salem district on flat salaries and as opposed to any diversion of the state market fund to other purposes.

The resolution concerning the prohibition department asserts that a determined fight is being made upon prohibition officers of the state by those opposed to prohibition for the purpose of letting down the bars for law violation, and declares "that we are opposed to any change in the law that will let down the bars so as to enable the bootlegger, the moonshiner, or the other violator of the law to carry on his business or debauching the citizenship of Oregon."

The market agent resolution declares that the office of the market agent has been operated efficiently and economically and to the best interests of the producer rather than to the special advantage of the class that makes a business of exploiting the producers.
