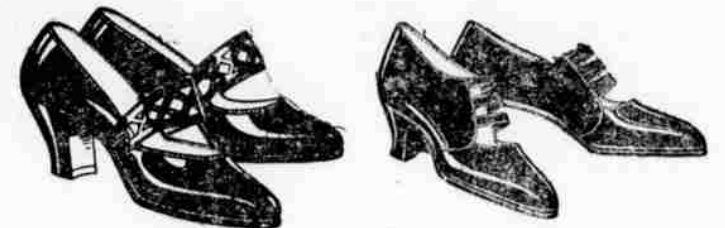

here today that he had been told by William Baker, who is facing liquor law charges that Federal Prohibition Commissioner Haynes and David H. Blair, commissioner of internal revenue were "fixed" to permit the smuggling into Washington of liquor for the Shriners' convention in June, 1923.

Baker and Rex D. Sheldon are on trial on charges in connection with the operation of a rum fleet off the Virginia and New Jersey coasts in 1923.

Washington, Jan. 23.—Prohibition Commissioner Haynes' only comment today on testimony in the Norfolk liquor cases referring to him was that he would not "dignify such a story by a denial."

### RAISE SALARY OF CABINET TO \$17,500

Washington, Jan. 23.—The annual salary of members of the president's cabinet would be \$17,500 instead of \$12,000 under a bill introduced today by Representative Fish, republican, New York.

In a statement Mr. Fish said that frequently cabinet officials, obliged to entertain extensively, have found their salaries inadequate and have been forced to resign in order to rehabilitate their finances.

New York's Coldest Day. New York, Jan. 23.—This was the coldest morning of the winter in New York. The official weather bureau thermometer registered 9 degrees the lowest temperature recorded here for this date since 1893, when the mercury dropped to four.
