

BEARCATS LOSE CLOSE GAME TO MISSIONARIES

In a game the result of which was in doubt until the final gun sounded, the Whitman college basketball quintet last night defeated the Willamette university aggregation by a score of 27 to 24. A disorganized Willamette defense, through which the Missionaries often had little difficulty in passing, was largely responsible for the Bearcats' defeat. Especially during the first half only the difficulty with which the Whitman players located the basket saved the Willamette team from being defeated by a larger margin.

On the other hand, the development shown by Robertson and Emmel was impressive. Robertson made several beautiful baskets from nearly half the length of the floor and Emmel, at the opening of the season, held his own with the best of them on the floor. Faenacht and Ericson played with their usual form.

Too many personal fouls caused Hartley, Willamette center, to be jerked early in the second half, thereby virtually sewing the game up for Whitman. Stelzels, who went in at center, did the best he could, but showed an inability to get the ball on the tip-off, as well as a general lack of experience on the floor.

Willamette led in scoring twice during the game. The first period ended with Whitman one point in the lead, the count being 19 to 15. At no time during the tilt was Whitman more than three baskets ahead of the Bearcats.
