DALLAS MILLS MAKE HOG FUEL FROM REFUSE

Dallas, Or., Jan. 30.—Utilization of mill refuse and wood waste, a large percentage of which has been going into the incinerator in the past, is a new policy that has just been put in effect by the Willamette Valley Lumber company at their big mill here.

At the present time the company is shipping four cars of "hog" fuel daily. Two of these go to the Willamette Clay Products company at Willamina, where they are used in the kiln burning operations of that concern and two to Salem for use as fuel at the paper mill.

Fifteen specially constructed cars are being built for use in this trade and it is possible that this number may be increased to 20 if the demand keeps up.

The hog fuel is measured on the basis of heat units in comparison with a cord of wood, 200 cubic feet of the hog fuel being the equivalent of one cord of wood. The cars are built to carry 16 1/2 units, making the total output of this type of fuel per day from the mill equal to 66 cords of wood.

While the utilization of the mill waste as hog fuel is an important step in mill economy, it necessitates an outlay of capital that will take some time for the hog fuel trade to repay, according to C. S. Keller, assistant manager of the company. The company has installed a machine to grind up the mill waste into the proper size, a conveyor to carry it to the cars and a special siding from which the cars may be loaded. In addition there is the expense of bottling the special type boxes on flatcars to convey the fuel to the market.

It commands a comparatively low price above the freight cost.
