

FREE TEXTBOOK PROPOSAL ONCE MORE IN HOUSE

Free textbooks would be provided for the public school children of the state under house bill 295 introduced by Woodward, Multnomah county, and Miller of Umatilla. Appropriation of \$250,000 to cover first purchases of the books would be provided for in the measure, which would be submitted to the people for approval at the polls.

Establishment of the Western Normal school and college at Seaside is asked in house bill 215. Bates of Clatsop county introduced in the house. The measure would be referred to the people under terms of the bill.

Provisions for changing county seats are made in house bill 214, introduced by Carlin, Jackson county. A special election may be called for the purpose upon petition of one-fifth of the voters casting votes at the last county election. On such petition a special election shall be called within 90 days. The bill is designed to aid in removal of Jackson county's court house from Jacksonville to Medford.
