

BILL TO STIFFEN REQUIREMENTS OF TEACHERS HIT

Objections raised by Senator Eddy, backed up by Joseph and others, against a bill introduced by the house committee on education to raise the grade standard of teachers entering Oregon from states caused the measure to be referred yesterday.

In Oregon a grade of 90 per cent is required for the granting of one-year certificates to teachers, and the bill considered yesterday provided that teachers from other states seeking one-year certificates in Oregon must have acquired the same standard in their home states. At present only 80 per cent is required of them.

Joseph wanted to know how many states the bill would "freeze out" from Oregon. Senator Butler admitted that it "would freeze out some states, particularly Washington, which does not recognize Oregon certificates at all."

Eddy attacked the bill as fixing an unjustly severe requirement, and Moser, who was not in the chair at the time, reminded Eddy that 90 per cent is the requirement for Oregon teachers and wanted to know if Eddy proposed to discriminate against Oregon teachers in favor of teachers from other states. Eddy replied that he would favor a bill reducing the requirement of Oregon teachers to 80 per cent. Joseph said he would also favor this.

Another bill by the committee on education in the house requiring teachers from other states to have a four-year high school course and at least 36 weeks of teachers' training, the same as required of Oregon teachers, was passed without opposition.

Representative Woodward's bill providing for physical examination of pupils in the public schools was passed by the senate.

Representative Winstow's bill providing for a full statement of indebtedness in municipal budgets was passed in the senate.

S. B. 171, Banks—Relating to incontestable clause to be included in the required slackard provision of life insurance problems.

S. B. 172, Upton—Relating to fire hazards and prevention.

S. B. 173, Upton—Requiring adjustment of water claims under Carey act.

\$4000 FOR POLK FAIR REQUESTED

Sum of \$4000 for providing premiums for the Polk county fair in 1925 and 1926 is sought in house bill 403, introduced by Representative Fuller, Polk county.

Salary of the treasurer of Linn county would be raised from \$1200 to \$1500 a year under house bill 404 introduced by the Linn county delegation. The county school superintendent's salary would be raised to the same figure.

Senator Joseph has introduced a bill which would give to all the circuit judges in Multnomah coun-

ty jurisdiction over probate matters instead of the present system whereby all probate matters are lodged in the office of Circuit Judge Tazwell. At present Tazwell, though he handles all probate matters, also has jurisdiction over other matters, and this would be continued under the Joseph bill.
