

BILL TO ENLARGE POWERS OF GAME BOARD APPROVED

The game commission would be given wider powers in declaring closed seasons on game and fish under the terms of house bill 198, passed yesterday afternoon by the house. When weather conditions made hunting dangerous or low water endangered the fish supply, the commission could stop hunting or fishing in areas it deemed advisable. The same bill would cover other emergencies that might arise.

House bill 156, which provides that assessment on lands in an irrigation project shall not be raised until improvements underway are completed, passed the house yesterday afternoon. Representative Oakes, Malheur county, introduced the measure.

FISH CODE GOES TO COMMITTEE

Offering of salmon and other protected commercial fish for sale in hatchery district No. 1 (the Columbia river area) during the closed season in the latter district under the subterfuge that such fish were caught elsewhere would be stopped under house bill 405, introduced by Pelree of Coos and Curry counties. The measure would provide for a system of tagging fish that would eliminate the practice.

The bill was drawn up by the direction of Carl Shoemaker, manager of the fish commission. The bill would provide for many changes in the commercial fishing code, most of them of a minor nature. Boat pullers would be granted licenses even though they were not citizens under one provision of the bill.

PUPIL LIMITATION BILL MEETS DEATH

Senator Brown's bill providing that a limit be placed on the number of pupils in one room schools was killed by indefinite postponement in the senate Thursday. This was by adoption of an adverse report of the committee on education.

The governor has signed the following bills: H. B. 53, Fisher—Relating to livestock running at large in Douglas county. H. B. 71, Hammond—Authorizing the state land board to execute the trust created by the will of John T. Apperson. H. B. 81, joint Washington county delegation—Providing for the eradication of bovine tuberculosis and other diseases of live stock and creating the office of herd inspector for Washington county.

H. B. 402, Cramer (by request)—To control white pine blister rust, and appropriating money for same. H. B. 403, Fuller—Appropriating money for Polk county fair. H. TRAFFIC PLACED UNDER SECRETARY OF STATE

The senate today passed Senator Maglady's bill which gives the secretary of state authority to employ all the officers used in the state traffic department and limits the number to not more than 25 men. At present the authority is centralized in his office but he is limited to seven men, and through a gentlemen's agreement the state highway department has added seven more, and all are paid from the same fund. The measure increases the salary of the chief state traffic inspector from \$260 to \$250 a month. Provision is made that traffic officers start at \$125 a month. After the first 12 months they are increased to \$125 and after the second 12 months to \$175.
