

### WILLAMETTE'S BEST DEBATER IS WITHDRAWN

Petty squabbling, resulting in an open break between Horace Rabakopf, debate coach at Willamette university, and Ward Southworth, his only experienced debater, caused Willamette's chances in debate to go glimmering yesterday, just before the clash with the University of West Virginia, slated for tomorrow night.

Inadequate preparation is given as the reason why Southworth is dismissed from the team on the eve of the greatest intercollegiate debate Willamette ever had, but those acquainted with the situation declare that the embers of hostility have been smoldering between the two ever since the season started. During the seven years that Southworth has debated he has never gone into a debate poorly prepared, although he habitually leaves the final writing of his speech until the last minute.

The present season is Rabakopf's first at Willamette. His system of coaching is a complete reversal of the system to which Willamette debaters have been accustomed. He has been successful heretofore, having coached a number of normal school debating teams. Southworth is the only man left in school who took the eastern tour with the team two years ago. A tour has been mapped out for the present season, which would take the team only about half as far east, but which involved debates with a number of colleges of considerably higher standing than the best of those met two years ago. It is now an open question whether Southworth will be sent on the trip, or if he is, whether he will be allowed to enter the debates except as alternate, or even whether the trip will be taken at all.

In tomorrow night's debate Willamette will be represented by Redding and Herriman, neither of whom have had any experience in college debate.

Southworth debated a number of years for Salem high school before entering Willamette, during one of which seasons his team won the state championship.

Gaston B. Means, long time investigator in the Department of Justice, and often tried for various crimes, but never convicted, has finally been found guilty by a New York jury and sentenced to two years' imprisonment for attempted jury fixing. Colonel Charles R. Forbes, former director of the Veterans' Bureau, has been found guilty in Chicago of conspiracy to defraud the Government. Herr Braun, Socialist, has been re-elected as Premier of Prussia, receiving 221 votes to the 175 cast for his Nationalist opponent, Kries. Lillian Gish, noted motion picture star, and Charles H. Duell, Jr., often reported engaged, have finally broken off friendly relations, and Duell has entered suit in New York to restrain her from appearing in pictures for anyone but him.

### BIBLE STUDY PASSES HOUSE

Senate bill 19, by Senator Eddy, excusing children from regular studies for 102 minutes a week to undergo religious instruction passed the house. Representative Woodward explained that the measure was superfluous as such a system is already in existence.

Congress would include indigent widows and minor children under the funeral benefit fund provided for ex-soldiers, ex-sailors, and marines of the union army, those of the Spanish war and of the Philippine insurrection. The funeral fund would be raised from \$60 to \$100.

The supreme court of Oregon would be required to give the governor, senate or house opinions when called upon under house joint resolution No. 10, adopted. Such opinions would only be asked by the house or senate on a majority vote. The aim is to avoid going to suit to have questions determined. Speaker Durdick introduced the resolution.

Congress would be called upon to enact legislation providing for a farmer's export corporation to dispose of surplus crops under house joint memorial No. 6, adopted.
