SILVERTON TO RETIRE LAST OF \$5000 BOND ISSUE

Silverton, Or., Feb. 9.—At a recent meeting of the Silverton water commission it was voted to take up the last outstanding bonds against the Silver creek water system. The total sum of the bonds was \$4000. The money for the payment of these bonds was raised from business during the past year. The low water period during the summer gave the commission much difficulty in supplying its patrons living on East Hill and Liberty Hill with the necessary water. N. Digeron, a member of the commission, advanced an idea to meet the difficulty. In brief Mr. Digeron plans to take the emergency pump at the plant and install it above the power plant on Silver creek. A part of the work which the commission plans to complete in the near future is 700 feet of 12 inch pipe on South Water and Rock streets, connecting with Main street and running to the reservoir.

SURCHARGES FOR PULLMAN CARS HELD JUSTIFIABLE

Washington, Feb. 9.—Surcharge imposed upon railroad passengers using Pullman facilities were held today by the interstate commerce commission to be justifiable, and railroads were authorized to keep the practice in effect.

The approval of the surcharge, under which every passenger occupying Pullman accommodations pays to the railroad an amount equivalent to 50 per cent of the Pullman charge, resulted from the first step of an investigation into the earnings of the Pullman company and the terms of its contracts with railroads.

The decision declared that the investigation had not proceeded far enough for the commission to express conclusions as to the general reasonableness of Pullman charges, but that the surcharge had justified itself.

"When the time comes for requiring the railroads to accept less passenger revenue than they now receive, those who experience the relative discomfort of ordinary coach travel, many of them because they must count the pennies, rather than those who select the most expensive and most luxurious form of transportation which modern railroads afford are clearly entitled to prior consideration," the major opinion said. "This showing justifies the conclusion that at least there is less warrant for eliminating the surcharge than for reducing the basic passenger fare which applies even to travel in mixed trains of freight and passenger cars."

The Willamette debaters presented their case with a grave seriousness, with the result that as an actual contest the debate meant little or nothing, the two teams being so widely divergent in their style.

Professor Fred G. Bayles, debate coach at Albany college, who acted as critic judge, stated that he would like to give the decision to West Virginia. "But I suppose I am expected to base my decision on the old style," he said, "so I will have to vote for Willamette. If Willamette wants to use a lot of publicity on the idea that they have defeated West Virginia, I suppose they are entitled to do so."

The open forum type of debating, which amounts to little more than a mere informal discussion of the question, is said to be due to the English influence on American debating. It came into evidence, particularly in the eastern part of the United States, a few years ago when American and English colleges began to debate against one another. It has been gaining steadily in popularity on the east, but last Saturday night was the first time that a Salem audience heard anything of the kind.
